
Did you know?

Total Submitted Responses – **229**






Response Rates – Community Involvement & Sector








Response Rates – Regional and by Community Group








At-Large – Responses


At-Large - Sector Responses


Learning Area Prioritization





Secondary Learning Area Priority – At-Large


Response Percentage Personal Skill Building At-Large






Secondary Learning Area Priority – At-Large
