LAST DAY: ICANN64 Prep Week, 25-28 February

Looking Ahead: New Travel Support Timeline

Starting with ICANN64, all travel support requests are now due 120 days prior to the next ICANN Public Meeting. This was previously a 90-day deadline. Therefore, the deadline for ICANN66 travel support is

5 July 2019. If applicable, community groups will need to adjust their election timelines accordingly to ensure new leaders are eligible in time for the ICAN66 travel support deadline.
