ccTLD News Session (1/3)

• Review of the .nz policy framework & policy related response to terrorist attack. *Jordan Carter* (.nz)

We would talk about the full review of our policy framework, how we are doing it and issues that have been raided by that point. We could also discuss policy related aspects of our response to the terrorist attack in Christchurch NZ on 15 March.

• The Pathway to Introducing .au Direct Registration. Cameron Boardman & Bruce Tonkin (.au)

In early 2016 the then auDA Board of Directors agreed to introduce direct registration of the .au 2LD. Despite significant internal conflict, government intervention, a change in registry operator and reform of the company structure, this long journey may come to end of the 1st of October, 2019 when Australian consumers will be able to register a .au domain name directly. This presentation will discuss the process, consultation, technical requirements and challenges over this period which may result in the largest change to the .au namespace in 15 years.

ccTLD News Session (2/3)

Moving 2.8 Million Names in Record Time. Alyssa Moore (.ca)

After a year of concentrated work – involving technical, organizational and policy modifications - .CA successfully migrated 2.8 million names to a new registry platform in 8 hours and 17 minutes. This presentation will focus on the effort of the entire organization that culminated in a clean and efficient move from old to new in record time. I will touch upon the process and technology change, the collaboration with the registrars, as well as lessons learned.

.AM ccTLD past, present, and future. Kristina Hakobyan (.am)

The presentation will be .AM ccTLD guidebook and will show the journey that the registry has passed since it was founded to the present days. Also, there will be the functionality of the registry in nowdays and future development plans, external and internal relationships, regulations and other activities.

• Legal considerations: Premium Domain Name Auction using the Twitter Platform. Edith Udeagu (.ng)

Brief introduction on NIRA, and .ng domain names. Explanation of the Auction process, followed by legal considerations and perspectives. next steps are a proposed development of an auction platform for NIRA

• The advantages of Blockchain and its application in a platform that inherits the Internet Governance model: Blockchain Federal Argentina. *Julián Dunayevich (.ar)*

Blockchain Federal Argentina sets in motion a model that inherits Internet Governance's tools and foundational principles but applied, for the first time, in a framework of Blockchain management at a national level. Moreover, this initiative was designed to ensure interoperability and synergy between similar ventures throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. Thus, thanks to the impulse of NIC Argentina and representatives of all sectors -civil society, private, local and national government, the academy and research communities- a space was built in which years of experience in a collaborative work could be applied. The result: a platform that, in this collaborative work logic, found the ideal model to consolidate a solid, reliable and open service. In this context, it is very interesting to analyze how all ccTLDs can find ways to take advantage of the benefits Blockchain has to offer. The ability to improve audit processes and to guarantee transparency and security, makes this new technology the ideal tool to optimize the administration of the registry and at the same time strengthen the DNS infrastructure.
