The Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG) was formed in December 2017, as a union of three At-Large Working Groups: At-Large Registration Issues Working Group, At-Large New gTLDs Working Group and At-Large ICANN Evolution Working Group.

The WG is Co-chaired by Jonathan Zuck and Olivier Crépin-Leblond. New people are welcome to join any of the component groups and they will then become a member of the CPWG automatically. But they cannot join the CPWG itself directly. The focus of the Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG) is directed towards policy comments and advice within At-Large, best practices for identifying Internet end user issues in the policy development process at ICANN, and engaging the At-Large community further on policy comments and advice.



ALAC Policy Advice Development Process Approach







Necessity for ALAC Policy Advice



 Does a topic or areas impact the interests of the Internet End-User*?



Decide if Statement is necessary

- > If yes:
 - How are those interests impacted, either positively or negatively?
 - ❖ What policy inputs can we offer that will strengthen the positive impact and/or prevent or lessen the negative impact?
 - Does the gravity of the impact require us to advocate our position beyond merely submitting a statement via the Public Comment process?
 - If no, then we decline to submit a statement.

Mechanics of ALAC Policy Advice



Who volunteers as Penholder(s)?

Works best if penholder(s) are At-Large Community member(s) who:

"Read, read, read"

- **"Read, *** Have relevant knowledge/expertise/experience
- read, ❖ Are active members of relevant Working Group
 - Read associated input materials, supporting documents, relevant past statements, etc
 - Understand the issues as they relate to End-Users
 - Are strong communicators
 - Often but not always drawn from amongst ALAC Members, ALAC Appointees or At-Large leaders
 - Can act singularly and/or in small team
 - Why? Because of what penholders are expected to do, which in turn is dependent on workload.





Mechanics of ALAC Policy Advice



What do Penholders do?

- Prior to drafting any statement:
- "Identify" ❖ Identify the issues as they relate to End-Users
 - "Scope" Preferably, present background to identified issues as contained in input materials etc
 - Where possible, present arguments/points raised /identified by other parts of the ICANN Community on those issues at relevant fora
 - Solicit inputs from At-Large members wiki workspace, mailing list, weekly calls, Googledocs etc
- "Develop" ❖ From inputs received, develop proposed positions to issues
 - Present proposed positions and re-solicit further inputs or where possible, establish consensus
 - (Ideally) then only start to draft a statement






Mechanics of ALAC Policy Advice



What else do Penholders do?

- Once draft statement is published:
 - Call for comments solicit further inputs or where feasible, attempt to again establish consensus for positions which did not enjoy consensus before
 - At-Large members to respond
 - Incorporation of further inputs, where feasible or relevant
 - ❖ As many rounds as needed within time limits / Public Comment deadline
- And finalize statement which then goes to ALAC for ratification prior to submission
 - In some cases, finalized statement is submitted first then re-submitted with ALAC ratification endorsement









- **New gTLD Subsequent Procedures PDP WG**
 - Policy Development Process (PDP) purview of GNSO Council
 - PDP initiated in Dec 2015, chartered in Jan 2016
 - WG started work in Feb 2016, considering changes as necessary to existing policy recommendations and implementation quidance
 - WG tackled > 40 separate topics via Plenary, Work Tracks 1-4, Work Track 5 on Geographic Names at the Top Level
 - Between Nov 2018 Mar 2019, undertook high level checks, clarification of public comments received
 - Now reviewing merits of public comments for reporting
 - WG work expected to go on until Q4 2019 Final Report 0

Section I: Description and Explanation

The <u>GNSO</u>'s New <u>gTLD</u> Subsequent Procedures Working Group (<u>WG</u>), which was chartered by the <u>GNSO</u> Council to conduct a Policy Development Process (<u>PDP</u>), is seeking to determine what, if any, changes may need to be made to the existing Introduction of New Generic Top-Level Domains policy recommendations from 8 August 2007 as well as the final Applicant Guidebook dated June 2012. As the original policy recommendations as adopted by the <u>GNSO</u>Council and <u>ICANN</u> Board have "been designed to produce systemized and ongoing mechanisms for applicants to propose new top-level domains", those policy recommendations remain in place for subsequent rounds of the New <u>gTLD</u> Program unless the <u>GNSO</u> Council would decide to modify those policy recommendations via a policy development process. The <u>PDP WG</u> created 5 Work Tracks that are responsible for considering the subjects within its charter. The <u>PDP</u> Working Group sought community input through two community comment periods. The Working Group has produced its Initial Report, which includes material from the full Working Group and Work Tracks 1-4. Work Track 5, focused on Geographic Names at the Top-Level, was established later than the other Work Tracks and will produce a separate Initial Report.

The objective of this Initial Report is to document the Working Group's deliberations on charter issues and preliminary recommendations, potential options for recommendations, as well as specific questions for which the Working Group is seeking input. Given the large number of issues, and the thousands of hours spent on addressing the 2012 New gTLD Program and improvements that can be made to the program moving forward, unlike other Initial Reports. The Co-Chairs not only believed that it was premature to measure the level of consensus of the Working Group members of dozens of recommendations contained within the Initial Report, but that doing so could have the unintended consequence of locking Working Group members into positions of support or opposition prior to soliciting public comment from the community on those recommendations. To form such definitive positions at this early of a stage could have the adverse effect of being less open to modifications to those positions as a result of community input.

In addition, though many of the preliminary recommendations were generally agreed to by members that participated in the different Work Tracks, support has not been assessed amongst the members of the overall Working Group. The Overall Working Group has not sought to form definitive positions on each of these issues at this stage. Therefore, any language in this report that suggests that the Working Group or any of its Work Tracks is making a recommendation should be read as merely a rough assessment by the Working Group co-chairs or Work Track leads.

After a comprehensive review of public comments received on this report, the Working Group will deliberate further on the preliminary recommendations contained within the Initial Report. It is possible that as a result of the deliberations, there may be supplemental reports released by the Working Group seeking additional public comments. Once all of that is completed, the Co-Chairs will conduct any formal consensus call(s) at the plenary level, on all recommendations before the Working Group issues its Final Report.

Section II: Background

In June of 2014, the <u>GNSO</u> Council created the New <u>gTLD</u> subsequent Procedures Discussion Group, which was focused on reflecting upon the experiences gained from the 2012 New <u>gTLD</u> round and identifying a recommended set of subjects that should be further analyzed in an Issue Report. At the ICANN53 meeting, the <u>GNSO</u> Council approved a motion to request that an Issue Report be drafted by <u>ICANN</u> staff, basing the report on the set of deliverables developed by the Discussion Group, to further analyze issues identified and help determine if changes or adjustments are needed for subsequent new <u>gTLD</u> procedures. The Final Issue Report [PDF, 1.38 MB] was submitted to the <u>GNSO</u> Council for its consideration on 4 December 2015 and a <u>PDP</u> on New <u>gTLD</u> Subsequent Procedures was initiated on 17 December 2015. The <u>PDP WG</u>has been meeting on a regular basis since February 2016.



Introduction

Alan Greenberg, At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC) Chair, Jonathan Zuck, member of the North American Regional At-Large Organization (NARALO), and Justine Chew, member of the Asian, Australasian and Pacific Islands Regional At-Large Organization (APRALO), developed an initial draft of the statement on behalf of the ALAC, in consultation with drafters from the At-Large Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG).

The At-Large CPWG held weekly calls in consultation with the community from 18 July 2018 - 26 September 2018, working from three Google Documents created by Jonathan Zuck, Justine Chew and staff, as well as the At-Large workspace to consolidate comments. Drafters of topics were assigned, including: Metrics for Consumer Trust/Choice - Holly Raiche, Evan Leibovitch; Community Prioritization/Applications - Justine Chew, Marita Moll, Abdulkarim Ayopo Oloyede, Yrjö Lansipuro, Nadira Alaraj; Fees - Bastiaan Goslings; Pics - Bastiaan Goslings, Holly Raiche; Applicant Support - Justine Chew, Alberto Soto, Marita Moll, Tijani Ben Jemaa; Objections - Justine Chew; Predictability & Clarity of Application Process - Justine Chew; Universal Acceptance - Eduardo Diaz, Satish Babu; Applications Assessed in Rounds/Batching Applicant Assessment (incl. Continuing Subsequent Procedures (2.2.1.c.1)) - Justine Chew.

On 21 September 2018, the first draft of the statement was posted on its At-Large workspace. On the same day, ICANN policy staff in support of the At-Large community sent a call for comments on the statement to the At-Large community via the ALAC work mailing list. Assigned drafters and At-Large community members added comments to the wiki workspace and consolidated final draft Google Doc.


On 26 September 2018, the CPWG met to finalize the ALAC statement draft. On the same day, the ALAC Chair submitted comment, and requested that Staff open an ALAC ratification vote.

In the interest of time, the ALAC Chair requested that the statement be transmitted to the ICANN public comment process, copying the ICANN staff member responsible for this topic, with a note that the statement is pending ALAC ratification.







Brief Overview

Purpose: This public comment proceeding is being opened in order to obtain input on the Supplemental Initial Report of the New generic Top-Level Domain (gTLD) Subsequent Procedures Policy Development Process Working Group, which is chartered to evaluate what changes or additions need to be made to existing new gTLD policy recommendations. The Working Group issued its first Initial Report, containing the output of the Working Group on the Overarching Issues as well as preliminary recommendations and questions for community feedback from Work Tracks 1-4, on 3 July 2018. This Supplemental Report contains additional issues that were deemed to warrant additional deliberations by the Working Group.

Section I: Description and Explanation

The GNSO's New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Working Group (WG), which was chartered by the GNSO Council to conduct a Policy Development Process (PDP), is seeking to determine what, if any, changes may need to be made to the existing Introduction of New Generic Top-Level Domains policy recommendations from 8 August 2007 as well as the final Applicant Guidebook dated June 2012. As the original policy recommendations as adopted by the GNSO Council and ICANN Board have "been designed to produce systemized and ongoing mechanisms for applicants to propose new top-level domains", those policy recommendations remain in place for subsequent rounds of the New gTLD Program unless the GNSO Council would decide to modify those policy recommendations via a policy development process. The PDP WG created 5 Work Tracks that are responsible for considering the subjects within its charter. The PDP Working Group sought community input through two community comment periods. The Working Group issued its first Initial Report. containing the output of the Working Group on the Overarching Issues as well as preliminary recommendations and questions for community feedback from Work Tracks 1-4, on 3 July 2018. This Supplemental Report contains additional issues that were deemed to warrant additional deliberations by the Working Group. Work Track 5, focused on Geographic Names at the Top-Level, was established later than the other Work Tracks and will produce a separate Initial Report.

The objective of this Supplemental Report is to document the Working Group's deliberations on several additional topics not covered in the Initial Report and preliminary recommendations, potential options for recommendations, as well as specific questions for which the Working Group is seeking input. As was the case with the Working Group's Initial Report, this Supplemental Initial Report does not contain a "Statement of level of consensus for the recommendations presented in the Initial Report." The Co-Chairs not only believed that it was premature to measure the level of consensus of the Working Group members on recommendations contained within the Supplemental Report, but that doing so could have the unintended consequence of locking Working Group members into positions of support or opposition prior to soliciting public comment from the community on those recommendations. To form such definitive positions at this early of a stage could have the adverse effect of being less open to modifications to those positions as a result of community input.

Any language in this report that suggests that the Working Group is making a recommendation should be read as merely a rough assessment by the Working Group co-chairs.

After a comprehensive review of public comments received on this report, the Working Group will deliberate further on the preliminary recommendations contained within this Supplemental Initial Report. It is possible that as a result of the deliberations, the Working Group may seek additional public comments. The Co-Chairs will conduct a formal consensus call on all recommendations before the Working Group issues its Final Report.

In June of 2014, the <u>GNSO</u> Council created the New <u>gTLD</u> Subsequent Procedures Discussion Group, which was focused on reflecting upon the experiences gained from the 2012 New <u>gTLD</u> round and identifying a recommended set of subjects that should be further analyzed in an Issue Report. At the ICANNS3 meeting, the <u>GNSO</u> Council approved a motion to request that an Issue Report be drafted by <u>ICANN</u> staff, basing the report on the set of deliverables developed by the Discussion Group, to further analyze issues identified and help determine if changes or adjustments are needed for subsequent new <u>gTLD</u> procedures. The <u>Final Issue</u> Report was submitted to the <u>GNSO</u> Council for its consideration on 4 December 2015 and a <u>PDP</u> on New <u>gTLD</u>. The ALAC supports the retention of auctions to be conducted by ICANN-appointed auction service providers as a mechanism of last resort to resolve contention sets within the Program in the first instance, with more guidance and resources to be put in place to help applicants get out of contentions sets voluntarily. The ALAC further proposes the ICANN Community explore the introduction of a multiplier-enhanced Vickrey auction in place of the regular highest-bid auction process as the resolution mechanism of last resort.


The ALAC continues to hold the belief that auctions, by design wherein the highest bid prevails, will naturally favour applicants with access to the greatest financial resources or deepest pockets and by extension, disadvantage less wealthy applicants (such as Applicant Support Program applicants). Whereas it is not always the case that the "best" applicant is the one with the most resources. For this reason, we strongly oppose the continued use of regular auctions as the mechanism of last resort for resolution of contention sets.

By this logic, an alternative contention set resolution mechanism, one based on comparative evaluation processes would strive for greater fairness along with the ability to select the "best"

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




