What is the ccNSO?

country code Name Supporting Organisation

The ccNSO may also engage in other activities authorized by its members.

Bylaw definition

ICANN Policy Development body, which shall be responsible for:

- Developing and recommending to the Board global policies relating to country-code top-level domains;
- Nurturing consensus across the ccNSO community, including the name-related activities of ccTLDs;
- Coordinating with other ICANN
 Supporting Organizations,
 committees, and constituencies
 under ICANN.



What is a ccTLD?

country code Top Level Domain

- 2-letter top level domains
 Examples: .uk (United Kingdom), .gt (Guatemala), .jp (Japan)
- correspond to a country, territory, or other geographic location (as listed in ISO 3166-1)

The rules and policies for registering domain names within the ccTLDs vary significantly.

Diversity ccTLDs, in:

- business and governance models,
- administration
- registration policies



ccNSO: Evolved functions & other activities

Policy-related work

- IDN ccTLD related work
- Use of country and territory names as TLDs
- Emoji Study Group

Platform function: exchange of information, networking, sharing best practices


- ccNSO members meeting days

Represent ccTLD community interests in ICANN ecosystem

- Interaction with ICANN Board and SOs & ACs
- Strategic and Operation Planning WG
- ccTLD voluntary financial contributions to ICANN

Why is ccNSO relevant?

- Provides structure for ccTLDs in ICANN ecosystem
- Approx. 250 different country codes
 - Every country at least 1 country code, countries and territories,
 country code assigned by ISO 3161 Maintenance Agency
 - IANA/ICANN is NOT in the business to determine what is not a country
- 59 IDN ccTLDs for for 41 countries & territories



Why is ccNSO relevant?

End of Q4 2018:

(source: Zooknic/Verisign DNIB, Vol 16, issue 1)

Total domain name registrations (ccTLDs & gTLDs):

• approx. 348.7 million

ccTLDs registrations:

 approx. 154.3 million (approx. 44 % of total domain names under management)

Top 10 largest TLDs by number of reported domains:

contains 7 ccTLDs

Top 10 ccTLDs:

composing 64.7% of all ccTLD domain name registrations



ccNSO Membership Structure

Who are the ccNSO Members?

- ccTLD managers who have agreed in writing to be members of the ccNSO
- Membership in the ccNSO is open to all ccTLD managers responsible for managing an ISO 3166-1 country code Top-Level Domain.

What is their role?

- Volunteers, participate in activities of ccNSO and other groups
- Elect Councillors (Bylaw)
- Nominate Candidates Board members seat 11 and 12 (voluntary arrangement)
- Final vote ccNSO PDP (Bylaw)
- 10% members may call for a vote on all Council decisions





ccNSO Council

The ccNSO Council is responsible for managing the policy development process of the ccNSO.

However, the role of the Council evolved:

- Manages ccNSO affairs
- Represents the ccNSO
- Selects ICANN Board members
 (Bylaw: after suggestion of members)
- Appoints ccNSO chair and vice chairs



ccNSO Policy Development

SCOPE | Defined in Annex C - ICANN Bylaws

- Limited scope for Policy Development
- Out of scope: all policies relating to registration of ccTLD domain names (local ccTLD policies)
- Policy applies to ccTLDs by virtue of membership, however major exceptions (applicable law and breach local custom, religion or public policy)

PROCESS | Defined in Annex B - ICANN Bylaws

- Heavy handed process
- Members vote, after Council vote
- Structural engagement GAC

CURRENTLY

- one ccPDP completed
- one IDN ccTLD overall policy awaiting Board vote
- One ccPDP under way. part 1: on retirement of ccTLDs; part 2: independent review mechanism decision relating to delegation, revocation, transfer and retirement of ccTLDs
