Meeting Notes

Work continued on the on self-certification guide. The group reviewed text added to the "Rating of systems based on ratings of components" section:

- Regarding the text "a system can have a high rating even if the components have a low rating or no rating":
 - An example was given that for an IMAP server the test criteria would be whether they
 comply with the EAI extensions. Even if they don't support the EAI extensions it can
 handle UTF-8.
 - A decision was made to add the following text: "For example, in an IMAP server the standard legacy character set is sufficient to enable a fully functioning EAI system. However, one which supports Unicode would have a higher rating."
 - An example was given from the discussion in the mailing list where someone questioned why an MUA can get a high rating even though it doesn't support EAI mailboxes. It was noted that it does its duty by enabling the entire system to support globally inclusive email boxes. It was noted that this is part of why the suggestion to add this paragraph was made.
 - A decision was made to move the example in the draft paragraph to the example bullet points: "For example an MUA may have PLATINUM certification based on being able to work with a mailbox with a globally inclusive email



address when combined with a mail server which itself can host globally inclusive email addresses"

- A note was added to move section to the front of the document.

The group then reviewed the "User Documentation and Communication" section:

- EAI communication and messaging
 - O It was noted that in order to get a high rating the vendor must describe their high level of support in their communications. This is because the EAI WG is a UA advocacy group, and one barrier to advocacy is there are good products that are not advertised as good. Communication is important and should be included as a part of their rating. A decision was made to keep this section.
 - A decision was made to add the following text to the table listing levels and requirements:
 - GOLD level for communication:
 - Marketing materials and public messaging promote globally inclusive email systems and features
 - Documentation clearly explains how to set up and administer globally inclusive email features, mailboxes and tools where applicable
 - PLATINUM level for communication:
 - Marketing materials and public messaging reference this selfcertification guide and indicate the level of support as determined by this self-certification guide
 - A suggestion was made to add that mentioning this document and the specific rating terminology is PLATINUM level
 - A suggestion was made that describing what you're compatible with, how to build a compatible system, and clearly explaining how to use it with compatible systems should be added
 - It was noted that making it possible for users to discover the globally inclusive capabilities of the product would be SILVER, clearly explaining the globally inclusive capabilities of the product would be GOLD and explaining the globally inclusive capabilities using the levels and terminology of this guide would be PLATINUM.
 - How to make a globally inclusive system out of this product or other products you need would also be PLATINUM.
 - It was noted that even if it's flawless in its implementation, if the features are not discoverable it should be SILVER as this reflects the goal of advocacy and promoting adoption and part of that is making adoption visible.
 - A decision was made to cement this concept
 - A suggestion was made to have separate bullet points for what it does for the end user vs. what it does for the administrator.
 - A table was inserted under section 1 of the "Self-Certification User Documentation and Communication" section:

- o A note was added to sort by experience and end user.
- o It was noted that work will resume on this section in the next meeting.

A brief discussion on use of "EAI" as a term was started. It was suggested that the term "globally inclusive" may replace "EAI". An objection was noted that "globally inclusive" would infer there's such a thing as something "globally *exclusive*". A decision was made to come up with new terminology as a part of completing work on the self-certification guide.

Academia as a stakeholder:

- It was noted that the EAI WG previously discussed organizations that create curriculum:
 - Sarmad mentioned that when he was in academia, they would regularly use <u>ACM courses</u>, and suggested reaching out to the teams that develop these curricula to get the relevant changes done in their recommended curricula



- It was noted that before the WG reaches out they should determine where changes are needed on the current curricula featured on the ACM website.
