2.1.2 Executive Committee (EC). The EC's principal functions

The EC's principal functions include:

- 1. Coordination of and among NCSG Constituencies;
- 2. Resolution of disputes among Constituencies; and
- 3. Allocation of GNSO Council seats to its Constituency Members according

to the procedures in Section 5.1 or management/administration of elections required to fill NCSG vacancies on the GNSO Council.

2.2 Constituencies.

2.0 Organization and Membership

2.1 Composition. The NCSG is comprised of two (2) structures.

2.1.1 Constituencies.

Constituencies are structures organized according to the ICANN Bylaws and approved by the ICANN Board for representation of Internet users within the Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO).

2.1.2 Executive Committee (EC).

The EC's principal functions include:

impartiality, accountability, and avoidance of conflicts of interest; and 1.2.3. Behavioral expectations of all CSG Members, including without limitation: adhering to ICANN Bylaws/Policies; supporting the bottom-up consensus model: treating others with dignity, respect, courtesy, and civility; listening attentively and seeking to and understand others; acting with honesty, sincerity, and integrity; and maintaining community good standing.

The guiding principles for the RySG, including its leaders and Interest Groups are fairness, openness, and transparency in all RySG policies, practices, and operations. The service standards for leadership positions include impartiality, accountability, and conflicts of Interest declarations. The behavioral expectations of all RySG members, Interest Groups and participants include adhering to ICANN Bylaws and Policies; supporting the consensus model; treating others with dignity, respect, courtesy, and civility; listening attentively to understand others; acting with honesty, sincerity, and integrity: and maintaining community good standing.

II. Reference to ICANN Bylaws

The basis for the GNSO as well as the RySG may be found in the ICANN Bylaws.

III. Organization and Membership

All Registries are eligible for membership in the RySG upon the "effective date" set forth in the Registry's agreement with ICANN. For all purposes under these Articles (including voting), each operator or sponsor shall be considered a single Registry member of the RySG (whether providing registry services for one or more than one gTLD or IDN version of a gTLD). Further, in cases where an operator or sponsor has a controlling interest in another registry operator or sponsor, either directly or indirectly, the controlled registry \operator or sponsor shall not be considered a separate member of the RySG. A Registry that is owned or controlled by, or under common ownership with, or affiliated with any entity that votes in another stakeholder group in either house of the GNSO is not eligible for membership in the RySG. Any question regarding eligibility or exceptions shall be

include impartiality, accountability, and conflicts of interest declarations; (d) commit to and require of its members adherence to ICANN Bylaws/Policies and support of the consensus model; and (e) encourage its members: (i) to treat others with dignity and respect; (ii) to listen attentively to understand others; act with honesty, sincerity, and integrity; and (iii) maintain community good standing.

2.0 Organization and Membership

2.1 Composition

The Registrar Stakeholder Group will be open to and comprised of ICANN accredited registrars. The Registrar Stakeholder Group will be open to the voluntary formation of Interest Groups comprised of ICANN accredited registrars as defined in Section 2.3 below.

2.2.2 Constituency Structure.

The internal structure, leadership, and operation of each Constituency will be governed by the Constituency Charter as approved by the Board and managed by its members in accordance with procedures in said

Charter. Each NCSG Constituency shall conform to the principles set forth in the

Section 1.2 of this Charter.

2.2.3 Constituency Rights and Responsibilities. Each NCSG Constituency shall:

- 1. Elect/appoint representative(s) to serve on the NCSG EC;
- 2. Nominate candidates and participate in elections for GNSO Council Representatives (CR);
- 3. Develop and issue policy and position statements with particular emphasis on ICANN consensus policies that relate to interoperability, technical reliability and stable operation of the Internet or domain name system;
- 4. Participate in the GNSO policy

IV. Structure of the RySG Interest Groups
