## **Some Basic Facts**

Adopted:	December 2004
ccNSO members (2004)	45
ccNSO members (2018)	165 (now. End-2019 172)
Call for vote on Council Decision	10% of members (5 in 2004, 17 in 2018, 18 in 2019)
Changes to the Rules	66% in favour (30 in 2004, 109 in 2018, 114 in 2019)





## **Basic Principles under the Rules**

- 1. The ccNSO is a bottom up organization where the members give guidance to the Council, as stated in the bylaws;
- 2. The ccNSO is open and transparent to members and nonmembers
- 3. The ccNSO will operate transparently and in public, wherever possible and on a non-discriminatory basis
- 4. There should be minimum periods of notice for meetings and votes
- 5. There should be a minimum turnout or quorum for a vote to be valid, with a regional representation.
- 6. The ccNSO operates on the principle of one member, one vote.
- 7. The ccNSO should be able to make decisions both at face to face (including teleconference) meetings and, also, by electronic ballot.
- 8. The ccNSO wishes to allow non-members to participate in discussions on issues before the ccNSO.

WHAT WE SAY

«The date, time and agenda of [ccNSO] meetings can be determined by resolution of the ccNSO Council or by vote of the ccNSO members.»



- 1. Meet at ICANN meetings
- 2. Trust our Meeting Programme WG with setting up agenda







«A quorum requirement only applies to physical (face to face or tele/videoconference meetings of the ccNSO).»



Irrelevant, as we do not vote at meetings.







«The quorum shall be 50% of the total membership of the ccNSO, and further at least two members per ICANN Region.»



There is significant disbalance between the number of members in different regions. We strive to be more inclusive.





- ICANN Bylaws have changed
- The ccNSO is a Decisional Participant
- The ccNSO cooperates closely with other SO/ACs


