Closed Items (Barcelona Onward)

- Issue Article 10.4 (a) ICANN Bylaws (membership definition ccNSO)
- Scope of Applicability of future policy
- Definition Trigger Event and End date retirement process
- Process of removal

Closed Items (Barcelona Onward)

- Duration of removal process:
 - Basic Duration: 5 years
 - Maximum Duration: 10 years
 - ccTLD Manager – IFO Agreement required

Oversight...

- Policy is directed at ICANN and IFO
- Not intended to amend the way ICANN interacts with the IFO
- Does not change role of the ICANN Board with respect to individual cases of
 - Delegation
 - Transfer
 - Revocation
 - Removal of ccTLD from the Root Zone

Review Mechanism...

- Review Mechanism to be developed by 2nd WG under this PDP.
- In the policy specific decisions have been identified which may be reviewed under Review Mechanism

Is this reasonable approach?

Exceptionally Reserved

- Exceptionally reserved: two letter codes reserved by the ISO3166 MA (4 in total)
- Trigger event: If MA makes a change a two letter code IFO to consider if change requires retirement. Retirement process further applies.
- Decision may be subject to review mechanism

Is this reasonable approach?

IDN ccTLDs

- Trigger event(s) for retirement IDN ccTLDs will be identified under ccPDP4
- Once Retirement of IDN ccTLD is triggered: retirement process as defined under this ccPDP applies

Next steps

- Policy document (with a couple of minor phrasing issues) is “locked down” (subject to stress testing)
- WG Stress testing phase started at Face to Face meeting earlier this week

Stress Test: what is it?

- Test the process as developed by applying the process to “corner case” situation and understand whether such a case results in a unwanted outcome or side effects.
- If the outcome of that situation results in an unwanted outcome or side effects. Policy/Process may need to be adjusted/refined.
