ASP to continue, should: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be open to applicants regardless of their location as long as they meet program criteria – ie eligibility</li> </ul>		Yes		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applicant must demonstrate how they would serve target region or community</li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Target Global South &amp; “Middle Applicant” (ie still struggling regions which may not be underserved or underdeveloped)</li> </ul>		Yes		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Definition of “Global South”, or agreement on how to describe underserved or underrepresented regions</li> </ul>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Employ longer lead times to create awareness, draw on regional experts, leverage tools &amp; expertise to evaluate applicant business cases</li> </ul>		Yes, outreach was very poor for 2012 round.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Extend financial support beyond subsidy on application fees</li> </ul>	<p>Yes, financial support towards items like application writing fees, related attorney fees, ICANN registry-level fees are useful.</p> <p>Is in addition to pro bono assistance program per <a href="#">CCT-RT Rec. 31</a></p>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Consider number of successful applicants as a measure of success</li> </ul>	Yes, but this is only one possible measure.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Need a clear set of metrics</li> </ul>	
4. No automatic termination of applications which do not meet ASP criteria	Yes, we advocated strongly for this. Unsuccessful ASP applicants should be allowed to choose either withdraw or transfer to standard application regime, with reasonable time give to pay balance application fee amount if choose to transfer.
