# ccTLD News | proposals (1/3)

## 1) .uk | Eleanor Bradley – proposal will be updated/refined

*The conclusion of the .uk second level release process*

In 2014 registration was permitted for the first time at the second level under .uk – for over 30 years registrations had been allowed only at the third level e.g. example.co.uk. As part of the release process the second level equivalents for c. 10 million existing registrations were reserved for a five year period. The five year reservation period ended in June 2019 and some 3 million outstanding rights lapsed. This presentation explains the challenges and approach in releasing this volume of domains in a technically secure and fair manner, and presents the outcomes of that release process. Includes national advertising, participation of over 400 registrars, resourcing up for disputes, coordination with our communities and govt, separate EPP connections so as not to impact daily ‘business as usual’ registrations. Significant coverage in the press, additional registration volumes and revenues for the registry.
