# Background

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- ICANN org published the Registration Data Policy on 2024-02-21
  - <https://www.icann.org/resources/pages/registration-data-policy-2024-02-21-en>
- Registry Data Policy Section 8.4 covers what Registry Operator **MUST** submit to escrow agent
  - ...
  - 8.4.8 Registrar Abuse Contact Email
  - 8.4.9 Registrar Abuse Contact Phone
  - ...

# Registry Escrow Specification

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- As required by the Base Registry Agreement, Registry Operators implement the data escrow format specified in [RFC 8909](#) and [RFC 9022](#)
  - RFC 8909 specifies the deposit file format
  - RFC 9022 specifies the objects
  
- Registrar's related information is specified in [RFC 9022 section 5.4](#), **Registrar Object**

# Implementation Gap

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- The Registry Escrow Specification ([RFC9022](#)) does not have dedicated fields that could satisfy the following escrow requirement from the Registration Data Policy
  - Registration Data Policy section 8.4.8 and section 8.4.9 for Registrar Abuse Contact Email and Registrar Abuse Contact Phone respectively

# Proposal - Utilize existing elements

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- Under the specification of [RFC 9022 Section 5.4 - Registrar Object](#), there are two generic contact elements <email> and <voice> that could be used to store Registrar Abuse Contact Email and Registrar Abuse Contact Phone respectively
  - In the case of deposits in CSV format:
    - <csvContact:fEmail>
    - <csvContact:fVoice> and/or <csvContact:fVoiceExt>
- ICANN org proposal is to publish an advisory instructing registry operators to use those two generic data elements for escrowing the Registrar's Abuse Contact information.

# Proposal - rationale

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- Rationale:
  - There is no need to update or extend the current escrow format.
  - Easier to implement compared to an escrow extension
  - Registry Operators may be using the generic elements to escrow other Registrar's contact information, but this should not be an issue:
    - ICANN org already publishes a public list with generic contact information of the Registrars: <https://www.icann.org/en/accredited-registrars>
    - Registry Operators and EBERO providers (in their role as RO) already have specialized points of contact within the Registrars.

# Next Action

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- ICANN org will draft the Advisory
  - Tentative title: **“Advisory: Guidance to Registry Operator regarding escrowing Registrar’s Abuse Contact Information”**
- IRT will review the Advisory
- ICANN org will publish the Advisory
- ICANN org will reach out to Registry Operators, Data Escrow Agents and EBERO providers regarding the existence of the Advisory
