- What is the role of ICANN Compliance in PICs?
- Can the role be clearer/stronger in meeting consumer expectations?



<u>Role of Compliance at ICANN</u>: Ensure that registries and registrars implement the community's policies and other contractual commitments by:

- 1. Addressing complaints against registries and registrars
- 2. Conducting audits to verify that the contracted parties are adhering to their commitments
- 3. Publishing reports on these activities for community review.



What are PICs?

- 1. Binding obligations
- 2. Subject to compliance oversight and enforcement by ICANN org
- 3. May be reviewed by a PICDRP panel
- 4. Any party harmed by a registry operator's failure to comply with its PICs can file a complaint



Complaint history:

- 34 complaints total, 28 invalid
- Three based on Spec. 11, Sec. 1
- One based on Spec. 11, Sec. 3
- None alleging Spec. 11, Sec. 2 violations
- Two breaches under Spec. 11 3(c) following PICDRP:
 - Top Level Spectrum, Inc. (feedback), 16 March 2017 <u>https://www.icann.org/uploads/compliance_notice/attachment/911/se</u> <u>rad-to-westerdal-16mar17.pdf</u>

Role is as strong as the obligations:

Unless obligations are clearly written and understood, they are unenforceable by Compliance or a PICDRP panel.
