Community Priority Evaluation (CPE) covers 10 Sub-criteria within 4 Criteria:

- Criteria #1: Community Establishment
 - Delineation & Extension
- Criteria #2: Nexus between Proposed String and Community
 - Nexus & Uniqueness
- Criteria #3: Registration Policies
 - Eligibility, Name Selection, Content
 & Use, Enforcement
- Criteria #4: Community Endorsement
 - Support & Opposition

At least 14/16 points to prevail



Expanding the Circle of Niche TLD Applicants

Applicant Support Program (ASP)

- 1. ICANN must actively coordinate the pro-bono assistance
- 2. Financial support for operational costs
- 3. Business model education
- 4. Concrete steps to raise/secure funding for ASP
- 5. Priority for successful ASP applicant in string contention; secondary benefit of a multiplier in auction bids for successful ASP applicant



Community Priority Evaluation (CPE)

- More community participation in selection of CPE service provider
- 2. Changes to CPE Process
- 3. Changes to CPE Criteria and Guidelines



Community Priority Evaluation (CPE)

To improve CPE utility for niche TLD applicants, At-Large calls for:

- Greater community participation in ICANN's engagement of CPE service provider / panellist
 - Desired criteria shortlisting final selection contractual terms
- Changes to the CPE Process
 - Mechanism for handling conflict of interest of panellists
 - Elimination of supplementary call for documented support or opposition
 - Limited challenge/appeal mechanism
- Changes to the CPE Criteria & Guidelines
 - Allowing a broader, more flexible interpretation of "community"
 - Inclusion of grassroot community expertise
 - Adjustment to Criteria, Sub-criteria and scoring guidelines to eliminate undue bias against unconventional communities (eg. Human Rights based, minority, linguistic, cultural, ethnic groups)
 - Preventing imbalance in considering opposition versus support
 - Lowering threshold to prevail in CPE

Applicant Support Qualifiers

Priority in string contention; secondary benefit of a multiplier in auction bids
