# Public Interest Commitments Made Eas(ier)

- PICs are add-ons
- Some PICs are Mandatory
- Some PICs are 'voluntary' but once made, are deemed to be part of the contract with ICANN
  - Of those, some can be enforced through ICANN Contractual Compliance, others can be enforced through the special PIC Dispute Resolution Procedure
  - The Main Changes GAC 'Safeguards': regulated sectors, highly regulated sectors and special sectors
- Other PICs are voluntary and stay that way (now called Voluntary Registry Commitments)
