- Approx 50 ccTLDs participate in the ccNSO Members Meetings
- Typically, a 2 day meeting at in-person public ICANN meetings

Final recommendations ccNSO Meeting Strategy review

- 1. Organise a ccNSO Members Meeting at every ICANN meeting
- 2. Ask the meeting programme WG to explore the possibility to organise a one (1)-day ccNSO Members Meeting during the Policy Forum (i.e. the second ICANN meeting of the year)
- 3. Keep the ccNSO Members Meeting as one (1) single stream, and do not organise parallel sessions.
- 4. Invite the meeting programme WG to keep in mind those priorities highlighted via the survey, when putting together the agenda for the ccNSO Members meeting, being:
 - a. Developing relations between ccTLDs
 - b. Providing updates by and to the ccTLD community

Furthermore,

- attempt to avoid unnecessary overlap or duplications with regional organisations' meetings.
- ensure that the joint sessions with other supporting organisations and advisory committees at public ICANN meetings are a valuable experience for all parties, in terms of their objectives and timing
