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1 Introduction and Background

According to the ICANN Bylaws, the ccNSO as member of the Empowered Community has the right to seek the removal of:

- A Director Nominated by the Nominating Committee holding Seats 1 through 8 by initiating the NOMCOM Appointed Director Removal Process (as described in section 4 of this Guideline).
- A Director Nominated by the ccNSO per <u>Section 7.2(a)</u> of the Bylaws by initiating the ccNSO Director Removal Process (as described in Section 5 of this Guideline)
- 3. All Directors (other than the President) at the same time by initiating the **Board Recall Process** (as described in section 6 of this Guideline)

The process for removal of a Director appointed by another Supporting Organization or Advisory Committee is out of the scope of the ccNSO. This Guideline does not apply to the initiation of such a removal process. The ccNSO procedures to participate in a community forum and/or support the removal petition of other SO or AC are described in section 7 of this Guideline.

2 Purpose of the Guideline

The purpose of this Guideline is to describe the roles, procedures and actions for the ccNSO in its capacity as a Decisional Participant concerning the removal of individual members or full ICANN Board of Directors. For purposes of this Guideline, the ccNSO consists of the ccNSO Council and ccNSO Membership¹, each with their respective roles and responsibilities.

3 General Provisions

3.1 Representation of the ccNSO

The ccNSO interacts with other Decisional Participants, the Empowered Community Administration, and ICANN through the ccNSO Council. For purposes of this Guideline, the ccNSO Council is represented by the **Removal Process Manager**.

¹ **Applicability of the Rules of the ccNSO**. According to the Rules of the ccNSO, a Council decision comes into effect 7 days after publication unless 10% of the ccNSO Membership notify the Chair of the they require a mebership vote to ratify or veto a Council decision. If the 10% threshold is met, a membership vote must be held and may start at its earliest five (5) days after the notification, and has to stay open for at least 14 days after the start of the vote. The member's vote is subject to a quorum rule: At least 50% of the members have to cast their vote in order to have a valid vote.

The Rules of the ccNSO are internal rules and operating procedures of the ccNSO in accordance with Article 10, section 3.k and Article 10 section 4.b of the ICANN Bylaws. These rules and procedures have to be consistent with the ICANN Bylaws (section 10.3 (k)). Therefore the timelines prescribed in the relevant section of Annex D of the ICANN Bylaws are paramount. For this reason NO decision of the Council with respect to the Board Removal section is subject to the Rules of the ccNSO. See note section 5.3.5.

3.2 Appointment of the Removal Process Manager.

The ccNSO Council will appoint a ccNSO Councillor to serve as the Removal Process Manager and another Councillor as the Alternate Removal Process Manager. To ensure continuity of process(es), the Alternate shall step in and take over the role and responsibilities of Removal Process Manager if the Councillor who is appointed as such is prevented from performing that role. The Alternate Removal Process Manager shall be copied in correspondence and participate in meetings as much as possible, however without taking any action, vote or be active in any other way, up and until the Alternate needs to step in. If both the Manager and alternate are not available, the ccNSO Chair is expected to and shall designate one or more other Councillor(s) to act as Removal Process Manager. Neither the ccNSO representative to the Empowered Community Administration (hereafter: ECA) nor the Rejection Action Petition Manager shall serve as the Removal Process Manager.

The appointment of the **Removal Process Manager** will be for one year, and the Manager may be reappointed, provided the Manager remains a member of the ccNSO Council. When the **Removal Process Manager** is appointed by the ccNSO Council or the Chair, all other Decisional Participants, the Empowered Community Administration, the ccTLD Community and the ICANN Corporate Secretary will be informed.

3.3 Obligations of the Removal Process Manager.

The Removal Process Manager shall:

- Inform the ccNSO Council, ccNSO Membership and broader ccTLD Community promptly
 and accurately when the ccNSO (Council) receives a Removal Petition or request to support
 a Removal Petition.
- Provide prompt and accurate accounts of actions and decisions relating to the Removal Processes by the ccNSO Council and the ccNSO Membership to other Decisional Participants, ECA, ICANN Secretary and ICANN Board.
- Inform the ccNSO Council, ccNSO Membership and broader ccTLD community of the
 actions and decisions related to the Removal Processes described in this Guideline by the
 other Decisional Participants and the ECA.
- Attend conference call(s) before a Removal Action Community Forum.
- Attend the Removal Community Forums.
- Act as point of contact for the ccNSO and ccTLD Community concerning the procedures detailed in this Guideline.

3.4 Communication.

The method of communication between the Removal Process Manager and the ccTLD Community, other Decisional Participants, the Empowered Community Administration and ICANN, including but not limited to ICANN's Corporate Secretary, is email.

All ccNSO information and communication concerning a Removal Process under this Guideline will be archived. For each Removal Process the ccNSO Secretariat will create a separate web page, wiki space section and archive, which will include:

- All communication and information to the community and all emails related to a Removal Process.
- Any other communication that is not by email between the Removal Process Manager with the ccTLD Community, other Decisional Participants, the ECA, ICANN Staff, or the ICANN Corporate Secretary. If necessary, the communication should be documented.

A link to the Archive will be published on the ccNSO website.

4.1 Nominating Committee Director Removal Petition.

This section details the procedures to be followed in case of a Removal Petition. It covers who may submit a Petition, how to submit a Petition to the ccNSO as a Decisional Participant, and how the ccNSO intends to accept or reject such petition. All references to "notices" and "notification" in this section need to be in writing, either as formal correspondence or email.

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4.1.1 Who may submit a Removal NOMCOM Director Petition to the ccNSO Council?

The ccNSO will consider NOMCOM Director Removal Petition from:

- ccTLD Managers,
- individual(s) directly related to a ccTLD manager,
- ccNSO working groups or committees mandated to submit such a petition,
- Regional ccTLD organisations (as defined in section 10.5 of the ICANN Bylaws),
- the ccNSO Council.

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4.1.2 Requirements NOMCOM Director Removal Petition

The ccNSO Council will only consider for acceptance a NOMCOM Director Removal Petition if the petition:

4.2 NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period.

- Includes the affiliation of the person submitting the Petition and how the petitioner or affiliation is affected
- Contains sufficient detail to verify facts; if verifiable facts are asserted
- Supplies supporting evidence if available/applicable
- Includes references to applicable by-laws and/or procedures if the assertion is that a specific by-law or procedure has been breached.

Finally, the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition MUST be sent to the following email address: ccNSO-Petition@icann.org to be considered. The Chair and Vice -Chairs of the ccNSO Council, the Removal Process Manager and ccNSO secretariat are subscribed to the email address.

Once the ccNSO has received a NOMCOM Director Removal Petition the ccNSO is considerd to be the Nominating Committee Director Removal PETITIONED Decisional Participant,

The NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period shall end 21 days after the start of this period. at 11.59

In accordance with ICANN Bylaws Annex D section 3.1 (b) the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period

The NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period shall be extended only as foreseen under 4.2.2.(v) below.

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4.2.1 Verification NOMCOM Director Removal Petition-

Within two (2) business days following receipt of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition, the Removal Process Manager together with the Chair and Vice-Chairs shall determine and advise Council whether all elements as listed in section 4.1.2 are included in the Petition.

If the Removal Process Manager together with the Chair and Vice-Chairs of the ccNSO unanamously determine that either:

- 1. the submitted documentation does not include one or more element(s) listed in section 4.1.2,
- 2. the Director who is the subject of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition has previously during the same term been subject to a NOMCOM Director Removal Petition that led to a NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum (as discused in Section 3.1 (e) of Annex D of the

the Petition is deemed to be rejected by the ccNSO Council. The Removal Process Manager, shall inform the petitioner and the ccNSO Council accordingly.

4.2.2 Actions by the Removal Process Manager, once a NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period has started

Within three (3) business days of the start the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period, the Removal Process Manager shall:

- i. Inform the ccNSO Council of receipt of a Removal Petition
- ii. Inform the ccNSO Membership of receipt of a Removal Petition
- iii. Instruct the secretariat to open the Board Removal section on the relvant web-page and in the wikispace.
- v. Inform the other Decisional Participants the ccNSO has recevied a NOMCOM Director Removal petition, and possible NOMCOM Director Removal Support Period the period during which other Decisional Participant need to decide, whether to support, reject or abstain from the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition.
- v. Invite the ccNSO Council, the Director subject to the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition** and the Chair of the Board (or the Vice Chair of the Board if the Chair is the affected Director) to a dialogue with the Petitioners and the ccNSO's representative on the EC Administration. This invitation has been extended upon reasonable notice and accommodation to the affected Director's availability.

If the invitation is accepted by either the relevant Director or the Chair of the Board (or the Vice Chair of the Board if the Chair is the affected Director), the ccNSO Council shall not decide upon the ccNSO Director Removal Petition until the dialogue has occurred or there have been reasonable efforts to have the dialogue. If as a result the dialogue is scheduled on day 18 or later into the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period the ccNSO Council meeting where a decision has to be made upon the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition shall be scheduled two days after the day of the dialogue, not being a public holiday. The NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period shall be extended accordingly if needed.

- vi. Propose dates for:
 - a. The ccNSO Council meeting to enter into a dialogue with the relevant Director, the (Vice-)Chair of the Board and the ccNSO appointed representative on the ECA, and the individual(s) who submitted the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition
 - The ccNSO Council meeting where the ccNSO Council shall accept or reject the petition, which shall be no later than one day before the end of the Period (which will be the twentieth (20th) day of the Period unless extended)

4.2.3 Rejection or Support NOMCOM Director Removal Petition.

During the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period**, the ccNSO Council shall decide to accept or reject the **NOMC Director Removal Petition**. The ccNSO Council shall meet either in person or via tele-conference, no later than one day before the end of **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period** (which - unless the period is extended in accordance with section 4.2.2 (iv) above - is the twentieth (20th) day) to decide whether or not to accept or reject the Petition(s).

The **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition** shall be deemed to be rejected, if one or more of the following conditions applies as determined at the sole discretion of the ccNSO Council:

- If one or more of the requirements of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition is/are not met at the time of the Council meeting.
- if, during the same term as member of the Board, the Director who is the subject of
 the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition has previously been subject to a
 NOMCOM Director Removal Petition that led to a NOMCOM Director Removal
 Community Forum (as defined in Section 3.1(e) of Annex D of the Bylaws)
- If the NOMCOM Director who is subject of the Removal Petition has not been invited
 or this invitation has been extended upon unreasonable notice and accommodation
 to the affected Director's availability.
- If the ccNSO Council has not reached a decision on the NOMCOM Director Removal
 Petition one day before the end of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period
 at 23.59 Pacific Time.

At its meeting, the ccNSO Council shall decide whether to support or reject the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition(s).** In taking its decision, the ccNSO Council shall consider:

- the feedback, views and input received from the ccTLD community, regarding the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition(s), if any;
- Remainder of the term of the appointed Director
- Other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

The **NOMCOM Director Removal Petion Notice** shall include the rationale upon which the removal of the NOMCOM Director is sought.

The decision to accept the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition** must be supported by at least 10 Councillors and at least one from each of the ICANN Geographic Regions.

4.2.4 Nominating Committee Director Removal PETITIONING Decisional Participant The ccNSO is considerd to be the Nominating Committee Director Removal PETITIONING Decisional Participant once the ccNSO Council has accepted a NOMCOM Director Removal Petition during the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period

4.2.5 Communicating the decision to accept or reject the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition. The Removal Process Manager shall:

Promptly, within 24 hours of the decision by the ccNSO Council to accept NOMCOM
 Director Removal Petition provide the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Notice
 to the Empowered Community Administration, the other Decisional Participants,
 and the ICANN Secretary.

The NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Notice must include:

- (a) the rationale upon which the removal of the NOMCOM Director is sought.
- (b) The contact information of the Removal Process Manager

If the EC Administration has not received the relevant NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Notice during the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period,

the NOCOM Director Removal Process shall automatically be terminated with
respect to the applicable NOMCOM Director Removal Petition

Inform the ccNSO membership of result of the ccNSO Council decision-making
procedure on the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition. The result shall be
published within 24 hours after the end of the (extended) NOMCOM Director
Removal Petion Period. The ccNSO shall be informed accordingly by the ccNSO
Secretariat on the relevant ccNSO and ccTLD mailing lists, as well as on the ccNSO
website and/or wiki.

4.3 Support other Decisional Participants for the NOMCOM Removal Petition

4.3.1 Solicitating Support from other Decisional Participants

12 Immediately following the submission of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Notice to the 13 Empowered Community Administration and the other Decisional Participants, the Removal Process 14 Manager, shall contact the other Decisional Participants to invite them formally to support the

NOMCOM Director Removal Petition accepted by the ccNSO Council.

All correspondence between the **Removal Process Manager** and other Decisional Participants, the ICANN Secretary, and the Empowered Community Administration shall be posted on the ccNSO website/or wiki space.

4.3.2 Supported NOMCOM Director Removal Petition

If the ccNSO receives the support for its NOMCOM Director Removal Petition(s) from at least one other Decisional Participant within seven (7) days after closure of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition Period, the ccNSO initiated NOMCOM Director Removal Petition shall be known as the NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition. Within twenty-four (24) hours of receiving said support, the Removal Process Manager shall provide a written notice on behalf of the ccNSO to the Empowered Community Administration, the other Decisional Participants, and the ICANN Secretary of having received the required support.

Additionally, the **Removal Process Manager** will formally submit the **NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition** to the:

- Empowered Community Administration,
- other Decisional Participants, and
- ICANN Secretary.

In accordance with Annex D Section 3.1 (d) (i) the NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition MUST include at a minimum the following:

- A supporting rationale in reasonable detail,
- Contact details for the Rejection Action Petition Manager, and/or contact details of the NOMCOM Director Removal Supporting Decisional Participant
- A statement whether the ccNSO and/or NOMCOM Director Removal Supporting Decisional Particpant requests that ICANN organize a publically available conference call prior to the Rejection Action Community Forum is requested,

- A statement whether whether the ccNSO and the NOMCOM Director Removal Supporting Decisional Particpant have determined to hold a NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum
 - A statement whether or not the NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum, should one be conducted, be held during the next scheduled ICANN public meeting.

4.3.3 No Support for ccNSO NOMCOM Director Removal Petition

- If, at the end of the seventh (7th) day after conclusion of the NOMCOM Director Removal Petition
- 8 Period no other Decisional Participant has expressed its support for the ccNSO NOMCOM Director
- 9 **Removal Petition,** the Process ends. The **Removal Process Manager** shall notify the Empowered
- Community Administration of the lack of support for the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition**.
- 11 Additionally, the Removal Porcess Manager shall inform the ccNSO Council and ccTLD community that
- the **NOMCOM Director Removal Petition** cannot go forward due to a lack of support from other
- 13 Decisional Participants. The ccNSO Secretariat will publish this information to the ccNSO and ccTLD
- 14 Community mailing lists, as well as post it on the ccNSO website/wiki.

15 4.4 Procedures with respect to NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum

- 16 This section details the ccNSO procedures with respect to a NOMCOM Director Removal Community
- 17 Forum. Unless explicitly determined otherwise, the NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum
- 18 Period shall start when the NOMCOM Director Removal Support Period (section 4.3 above) ends and
- 19 closes after twenty-one (21) days³.

20 **4.4.1** Community Forum

- 21 Following the ICANN announcement to convene a NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum, the
- 22 **Removal Process Manager** will inform the ccNSO community on the details of this Forum.
- 23 The ccNSO, via the Removal Process Manager, will participate in any NOMCOM Director Removal
- 24 **Community Forum** convened by ICANN.

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4.4.2 ccNSO community input

- 27 The **Removal Process Manager** will request the ccTLD community to provide input and/or feedback on
- 28 the Supported Petition(s) to inform the NOMCOM Director Removal Community Forum. The manner in
- $29 \qquad \text{which the input and feed-back will be requested from the community and then provided to the ECA will} \\$
- $30\,$ be determined by the ccNSO Council prior to requesting the ccNSO community to provide their feed-
- 31 back and input.
- The ccNSO Council is advised to discuss how the ccNSO community should provide input and feed-back at its meeting to decide to support a Rejection Action Petition (section 4.3.4 above).

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4.4.3 Rescinding Support of the Supported Petition during the Community Forum Period

- During any time up and until the eighth (8th) day before the end of the **NOMCOM Director Removal**
- 37 Community Forum Period, the ccNSO Council may elect to rescind its support of the NOMCOM Director
- 38 Removal Supported Petition. The decision to rescind shall be made by a 2/3 super-majority vote of the
- 39 votes cast by a quorate⁴ ccNSO Council.

4.5 Final Decision NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition

- 16 Chair of the ccNSO Council shall schedule a Council meeting for final decision making on the NOMCOM
- 17 Director Removal Supported Petition(s).
- 18 This ccNSO Council meeting should be scheduled by the thirteenth (13th) day of the **NOMCOM Director**
- 19 **Removal Supported Petitoin Decision Period**, which directly follows the Community Forum Period.

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4.5.2 The ccNSO Decision

- No later than on the thirteenth (13th) day at 23.59 UTC of the Rejection Action Decision Period, the ccNSO Council must have decided whether to:
 - Support the NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition (and thereby support the removal
 of the NOMCOM Director),
 - Object to the NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition, or
 - Abstain from the matter. Abstention will not count as support or objection to a NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition.

In taking its decision, the ccNSO Council shall consider:

- the feed-back, views and input received from the ccNSO Community regarding the NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition;
- the importance of the matter for the ccNSO Community and other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

The ccNSO Council decision to support the **NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition** has to be taken with a super-majority of 2/3 of the votes cast supporting the Petition at a quorate ccNSO Council meeting.

The ccNSO Council decision to reject the **NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition** has to be taken by a simple majority of the votes cast rejecting the Petition at a quorate ccNSO Council meeting.

This ccNSO Council decision to support or reject a **NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition** is subject to Rules of the ccNSO. The ccNSO Council decision shall be published on the ccNSO website/wiki as soon as practically possible and the ccNSO community shall be informed about the decision by the Removal Process Manager.

If the ccNSO Council decision is not effective by the 20th day at 23.59 Pacific Time of the **NOMCOM** Director Removal Supported Petition Decision Period (as defined in the ICANN Bylaws), the ccNSO is deemed to have abstained from the matter.

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4.6 NOMCOM Director Removal Notice

As soon as the ccNSO Council's decision has become effective, and prior to 21st day, 23:59 Pacific Time (the local time of the LA office of ICANN) the Removal Process Manager MUST have conveyed the notice to the Empowered Community Administration and the ICANN Secretary whether the ccNSO supports, rejects or abstains from the **NOMCOM Director Removal Supported Petition**. This notice shall be published on the relevant ccNSO and ccTLD mailing lists, as well as the ccNSO website/wiki.

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In the event that the ccNSO Council has been deemed to have abstained (e.g., has not taken a timely decision according to section), the Removal Process Manager shall inform the Empowered Community Administration and the ICANN Secretary accordingly within the timeline mentioned in this section. This notification shall be published on the relevant ccNSO and ccTLD mailing lists, as well as on the ccNSO website/wiki.

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5.1 ccNSO Director Removal Petition.

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This section details the procedures to be followed in case of a Removal Petition. It covers who may submit a Petition, how to submit a Petition to the ccNSO as a Decisional Participant, and how the ccNSO intends to accept or reject such a petition. All references to "notices" and "notification" in this section need to be in writing, either as formal correspondence or email.

5.1.1 Who may submit a Removal ccNSO Director Petition to the ccNSO Council?

The ccNSO will consider Petition from anyone, [who has a clear and demonstrated interest in the removal of the ccNSO Director]

5.1.2 Requirements ccNSO Director Removal Petition

The ccNSO Council will only consider for acceptance a **ccNSO Director Removal Petition** if the petition:

- Is in writing
- Includes the affiliation of the person submitting the Petition and how the petitioner or affiliation is affected
- Contains sufficient detail to verify facts; if verifiable facts are asserted
- Supplies supporting evidence if available/applicable
- Includes references to applicable bylaws and/or procedures if the assertion is that a specific bylaw or procedure has been breached.

Finally, the ccNSO Director Removal Petition MUST be sent to the following email address: ccNSO-Petition@icann.org to be considered. The Chair and Vice-Chairs of the ccNSO Council, the Removal Process Manager and the ccNSO Secretariat are subscribed to the email address.

5.2 ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period.

Per ICANN Bylaws Annex D section 3.2 (b), the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period shall start on the date that the ccNSO Council has received the ccNSO Director Removal Petition, hereafter the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Date. The ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period shall end 21 days after the start of this period. at 11.59 Pacific Time⁶

The ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period shall be extended only as foreseen under 5.2.2. (iv) below.

5.2.1 Verification ccNSO Director Removal Petition-

Within two business days following receipt of the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition**, the **Removal Process Manager**, together with the Chair and Vice-Chairs, shall determine and advise Council whether all elements as listed in section 5.1.2 are included in the Petition.

If the **Removal Process Manager**, together with the Chair and Vice-Chairs of the ccNSO, unanimously determine that either:

the submitted documentation does not include one or more element(s) listed in section 5.1.2, or

The Removal Process Manager shall inform the petitioner and the ccNSO Council accordingly.

5.2.2 Actions by the Removal Process Manager, once a ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period has started

Within two business days of the start of the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period, the Removal Process Manager shall:

- vii. Inform the ccNSO Council of receipt of a Removal Petition
- viii. Inform the ccNSO Membership of receipt of a Removal Petition
- ix. Instruct the secretariat to open the Board Removal section on the relevant web-page and in the wikispace.
- Invite the ccNSO Council, the Director subject to the ccNSO Director Removal Petition and the Chair of the Board (or the Vice-Chair of the Board if the Chair is the affected Director) to a dialogue with the Petitioners and the ccNSO's representative on the EC Administration. This invitation has been extended upon reasonable notice and accommodation to the affected Director's availability.

 If the invitation is accepted by either the relevant Director or the Chair of the Board (or the Vice-Chair of the Board if the Chair is the affected Director), the ccNSO Council shall not decide upon the ccNSO Director Removal Petition until the dialogue has occurred or there have been reasonable efforts to have the discussion. If, as a result, the dialogue is scheduled on day 18 or later into the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period the ccNSO Council meeting where a decision has to be made upon the ccNSO Director Removal Petition shall be scheduled two days after the day of the dialogue, not being a public holiday. The ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period shall be extended accordingly if needed.
- xi. Propose dates for:
 - c. The ccNSO Council meeting to enter into a dialogue with the relevant Director, the (Vice-)Chair of the Board and the ccNSO appointed representative on the ECA, and the individual(s) who submitted the ccNSO Director Removal Petition
 - d. The ccNSO Council meeting where the ccNSO Council shall accept or reject the petition, which shall be no later than one day before the end of the Period (which will be the twentieth (20th) day of the Period unless extended)

5.2.3 Rejection or Support ccNSO Director Removal Petition.

During the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period**, the ccNSO Council shall decide to accept or reject the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition**. The ccNSO Council shall meet either in person or via teleconference, no later than one day before the end of **ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period** (which - unless the period is extended per section 5.2.2 (iv) above - is the twentieth (20th) day) to decide whether or not to accept or reject the Petition(s).

The ccNSO Director Removal Petition shall be deemed to be rejected if one or more of the following conditions applies as determined at the sole discretion of the ccNSO Council:

 Forum (as defined in Section 3.2(d) of Annex D of the Bylaws)
- If the ccNSO Director who is subject of the Removal Petition has not been invited or this invitation has been extended upon unreasonable notice and accommodation to the affected Director's availability.
- If the ccNSO Council has not decided on the ccNSO Director Removal Action Petition one day before the end of the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period at 23.59 Pacific Time.

At its meeting, the ccNSO Council shall decide whether to support or reject the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition(s)**. In taking its decision, the ccNSO Council shall consider:

- the feedback, views and input received from the ccTLD community, regarding the ccNSO Director Removal Petition(s), if any;
- The remainder of the term of the ccNSO appointed Director
- Other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

If the ccNSO Council decides to support the Petition, it must decide whether to request the ECA to hold a Community Forum at the first upcoming ICANN meeting (Section 3.2 (d) (ii) Annex D of the ICANN Bylaws), and the ccNSO Council is advised to discuss how the ccTLD community could provide input and feedback during the Community Forum.

The decision to accept the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition** must be supported by at least 10 Councillors and at least one from each of the ICANN Geographic Regions.

5.2.4 Communicating the decision to accept or reject the ccNSO Director Removal Decision. The Removal Process Manager shall:

Promptly, within 24 hours of the decision by the ccNSO Council to accept ccNSO
 Director Removal Petition provide the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Notice to
 the Empowered Community Administration, the other Decisional Participants, and
 the ICANN Secretary.

Per the Bylaws⁷ the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition Notice** must include:

- (c) A supporting rationale in reasonable detail
- (d) The contact information of the Removal Process Manager
- (e) A ccNSO Council statement whether or not the ccNSO requests that ICANN organize a publicly-available conference call before the ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum

(f) A statement as to whether the ccNSO has determined to hold the ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum during the next scheduled ICANN public meeting.

If the EC Administration has not received the relevant ccNSO Director Removal Petition Notice during the ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period, the ccNSO Director Removal Process shall automatically be terminated with respect to the applicable ccNSO Director Removal Petition

- Additionally, the ccNSO's representative to the Empowered Community Administration shall be informed of the decision reached by the ccNSO Council.
- 5. Inform the ccNSO Membership of the result of the ccNSO Council decision making procedure on the ccNSO Director Removal Petition. The result shall be published within 24 hours after the end of the (extended) ccNSO Director Removal Petition Period. The ccNSO shall be informed accordingly by the ccNSO Secretariat on the relevant ccNSO and ccTLD mailing lists, as well as on the ccNSO website and/or wiki.

5.3 ccNSO appointed Director Removal Community Forum

5.3.1 ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum

Any SO/AC Director Removal Action Community Forum, including the ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum, shall be convened by ICANN at the direction of the ECA. The **ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum** is the forum at which the Decisional Participants and interested parties may discuss the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition Notice**

5.3.2 ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum Period. Unless the ccNSO Council has requested the forum to be held in conjunction with an ICANN meeting, the ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum Period shall start at the expiration of the **ccNSO Removal Petition Period** and ending on the **21**st day after the expiry of the **ccNSO Removal Petition Period** at 23:59 (Pacific Time).

If the ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum shall be held during the next scheduled ICANN public meeting as requested by the ccNSO and on the date and at the time determined by ICANN, and that public meeting is held after 11:59 p.m. (as calculated by local time at the location of ICANN's principal office) on the 21st day after the expiration of the ccNSO Removal Petition Period, the ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum Period shall expire on the official last day of such ICANN public meeting at 11:59 p.m., local time of the city hosting such ICANN public meeting.

5.3.3 Informing the community. Following the ICANN announcement of convening the **ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum**, the **Removal Process Manager** shall inform the ccTLD community on the details of the Community Forum. Note that no individual from the ccNSO, nor the individual who initiated the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition**, shall be permitted to participate in the management or moderation of the **ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum**.

The **Removal Process Manager** shall – after consulting the Chair of the ccNSO - convene a ccNSO Council meeting by the eighth (8th) day before the end of the **ccNSO Director Removal Action**

- 1 Community Forum Period. This meeting is intended to allow for a timely Council decision on the issue
- 2 identified in the ccNSO Director Removal Petition.

5.3.4 Community Feedback.

The **Removal Process Manager** will request the ccTLD community to provide input and / or feedback from the ccTLD community on the **ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum**. The input and / or

feedback is required to be provided through the ccNSO Council to the Empowered Community

Administration. How the input and feedback from the community will be provided to the Empowered

8 Community Administration will be determined by the ccNSO Council before giving such feedback. For

9 example, the ccNSO Council could decide that the most appropriate manner will be a ccNSO Statement 10 according to the ccNSO Statement procedure.

To determine the most appropriate course of action, the ccNSO Council will take into account and will be guided by the anticipated timelines, the importance of the matter under consideration for the ccTLD community as indicated by the quantity and quality of the feedback and input received by the ccNSO Council and other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

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5.3.5 Results of Community Forum to be shared with ccNSO Council and ccNSO Membership. To ensure that the ccNSO Council and members are informed about the results of the community forum, the Removal Process Manager will summarize the proceedings of the community forum and share them on the list as soon as possible after the closure of the ccNSO Director Removal Action Community Forum Period.

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5.3.6 Resolution of Issue during the Community Forum Period

During any time up and until the eighth (8th) day before the end of the **ccNSO Director Removal Action**Community Forum Period, the ccNSO Council may elect to agree that the issue raised in the **ccNSO**Director Removal Petition has been resolved. The decision to recognize that the issue has been resolved must be supported by at least 10 Councillors and at least one form each of the ICANN Geographic Region.

In making its decision, the ccNSO Council shall consider:

 the feed-back, views and input received from the ccNSO community and others regarding ccNSO Director Removal Petition;

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This ccNSO Council decision is NOT subject to the Rules of the ccNSO. However, the ccNSO Council decision shall be published on the ccNSO website/wiki as soon as practically possible, and the ccNSO Members shall be informed about the decision by the ccNSO Secretariat. It will become effective 7 calendar days after publication. If during the period starting after the Council decision and before the end of the Community Forum 34 % of ccNSO Members object, the decision will be rescinded, and not

end of the Community Forum 34 % of ccNSO Members object, the decibecome effective.

Other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

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Once the decision has become effective, the **Removal Process Manager** shall notify the ECA, the other Decisional Participants, and the ICANN Secretary of the decision by the ccNSO Council to agree that the issue identified in the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition** has been resolved.

5.4 ccNSO Director Removal Comment Period

Directly following the expiration of the **ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum Period** and at the request of the ECA, ICANN shall issue a request for comments and recommendations. The **ccNSO Director Removal Comment Period** shall start on the day the request for comments was posted on the ICANN website and expire on the seventh (7th) day after the posting at 23.59 PST (Pacific Time).

On the day the ccNSO Director Comment Period starts the Removal Process Manager shall inform the ccTLD community of the start of the ccNSO Director Removal Comment Period and convene a ccNSO Council meeting between the sixth (6th) and no later than the tenth (10th) day at 23.59 UTC following the expiration of the ccNSO Director Comment Period. At this meeting, the ccNSO Council is expected to decide whether to agree or object to the ccNSO Director Removal Petition.

After the closure of the ccNSO Director Removal Comment Period, the Removal Process Manager will inform the Councillors and ccNSO Membership of the closure and will forward the (links to) the comments and recommendations received, if any.

5.5 ccNSO Director Removal Decision

5.5.1 Definition ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period. The **ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period** shall start at the end of the expiration of the **ccNSO Director Removal Comment Period** and close on the twenty-first 21st day at 23.59 Pacific Time after the expiry of this period.

5.5.2 Decisions During the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period. During the **ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period,** the ccNSO shall decide whether or not the ccNSO supports the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition**.

In taking its decision, the ccNSO Council shall consider:

- the feed-back, views and input received:
 - from the ccNSO Director who is subject of the ccNSO Director Removal Petition and the Chair of the Board, if any
 - The Petitioner, if any
 - the ccNSO and broader ccTLD Community, if any
 - during the ccNSO Director Removal Community Forum
 - during the ccNSO Board Director Removal Comment Period
- Other factors deemed relevant by the ccNSO Council.

The ccNSO Council decision whether to support or reject the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition** has to be taken ultimately at the eleventh (11th) day at noon (12.00) UTC into the **ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period**.

5.5.2.1. Supermajority ccNSO Council Decision to support the ccNSO Director Removal Petition. The ccNSO Council decision to support the ccNSO Director Removal Petition must be taken with a supermajority of 14 or more Councillors and at least one from each of the ICANN

 Geographic Regions. The ccNSO Council decision shall be published on the ccNSO Website immediately following the closure of the meeting and shall include an explanation of the reasons as to why it has chosen to remove the ccNSO appointed Director.

The Decision becomes effective on the 20th day of the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period at 23.59 UTC unless by the 20th day into the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period, UNLESS at least 34 % of the ccNSO Members indicated not to support the decision of the ccNSO Council. The Rules of the ccNSO do NOT apply to this decision of the ccNSO Council.

5.5.2.2 ccNSO Council Decision to reject the ccNSO Director Removal Petition
If the ccNSO Council does not support the ccNSO Director Removal Petition (i.e., there is no supermajority to support the Petition), the ccNSO Council decision shall be published on the ccNSO Website immediately following the closure of the meeting. The ccNSO Council decision shall include an explanation of the reasons as to why it has not supported the ccNSO Director Removal Petition.

The Decision shall become effective on the 20th day of the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period at 23.59 UTC unless by the 20th day into the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period, UNLESS at least 67 % of the ccNSO Members indicate support for the ccNSO Director Removal Petition. The Rules of the ccNSO do NOT apply to this decision of the ccNSO Council.

5.5.2.3 No ccNSO Council Decision or if too late

If the ccNSO Council has not decided by the 11th day at noon (12.00) UTC into the ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period, the ccNSO Council shall be deemed not to support the ccNSO Board Removal Petition. The Removal Process Manager shall inform the community accordingly by the 11th day at 23.59 UTC. If by the 20th day into ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period at least 67% of the ccNSO Members indicate to support the ccNSO Director Removal Petition, the ccNSO Director Removal Petition is deemed to be supported.

5.5.3 Lack of support removal decision. If the ccNSO does not support the **ccNSO Director Removal Petition** by the 20th day at 23.59 UTC into **ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period**, the **ccNSO Director Removal Process** is closed from a ccNSO perspective. On the 21st day into the **ccNSO Director Removal Decision Period** before 23.59 UTC, the **Removal Process Manager** shall inform the ccNSO appointed Directors, the ccTLD community and the ECA accordingly.

5.6 ccNSO Director Removal Notice

Within 24 hours after the decision to support/accept the ccNSO Director Removal Petition has become effective, the Removal Process Manager shall inform in writing the EC Administration, the other Decisional Participants and Secretary that the ccNSO has accepted the ccNSO Removal Action Petition following the internal procedures of the ccNSO and with a three-quarter majority (the ccNSO Director Removal Notice).

The **Removal Process Manager** shall act on behalf of the ccNSO Council direct ICANN to post concurrently with the **ccNSO Director Removal Notice** submission the ccNSO explanation as to why the ccNSO has chosen to remove the affected Director.

- the ccNSO Council.

6.1.2 Requirements Board Recall Petition

The ccNSO Council will only consider for acceptance a **Board Recall Petition** if the petition:

6.3.3 No Support for ccNSO Board Recall Petition

The **Removal Process Manager** shall notify the Empowered Community Administration of the lack of support for the **Board Recall Petition**. In the notification the Removal Porcess Manager, will tentatively include a suggested date for a Council meeting for decision to suppor-making by the ccNSO Council and other information deemed relevant.

7.1.1 Alert ccNSO Council and ccNSO membership. Alternative B. As soon as the Removal Process
