Dear Olivier, Paul, Byron and Jonathan;

On 3 July I sent a note to the SO-AC Chairs list on behalf of Dave Archbold asking for feedback on the Final Report of the Geographic Regions Review Working Group by 17 October.

On one hand Dave was delighted to receive no objections to the Final Report recommendations from any organization. On the other hand, the Charter of the Working Group approved by the ICANN Board requires that Dave receive some written notification from each of the organizations that contributed members to the Working Group before the Final Report can be submitted formally to the ICANN Board.
