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The Problem as Identified

- There are a *great number* of recommendations and sub parts of recommendations made from several sources that are not yet or not yet fully implemented.
- There are various limitations or resourcing issues associated with implementation.
- There are yet to be implemented or finalised recommendations that have been overshadowed or superseded with others.
- There are *many* recommendations that are yet to be implemented because it is no longer clear what outcome they were designed to cause
- There are some that are just *no longer relevant to the current ICANN

ATRT3 made the following Recommendation

Section 10 - Prioritization and Rationalization of Activities, Policies, and Recommendations (see 10.4)

ATRT3 recommends the following guidance for ICANN org in the creation of a community-led entity tasked with operating a prioritization process for recommendations made by review teams, cross-community groups, or any other community-related budgetary elements the Board or ICANN org feels appropriate

ATRT3 then goes on to outline guidance for the creation of such a community-led entity, as well as some standards and expectations regarding its operation and purpose.

TRIAGE
