Objective: The ICANN Community have produced hundreds of recommendations for reforms, from the CCWG WS2, the CCTRT, the SSR2 and RPM. More recently, the ATRT3 make 5 recommendations to include some suggestions for how the community might go about addressing these issues.

At-Large members were active participants of this groups, have we identified our **own** priorities for reforms?.

This session is just the beginning of organizing all these recommendations and more importantly what the At-Large priorities should be.



WS2: Nearly 100 recommendations

CCTRT: 35 recommendations.

SSR2: 31 recommendations (including the need to implement the 28 SSR1

recommendations.

Enhancing the Effectiveness of ICANN's Multistakeholder Model: Work in progress, more comments than recommendations

ATRT2: 46 (51) recommendations.

ATRT3: 5 recommendations.

RPM: 7 Procedures



Although some of this recommendations were already adopted by the board, and implemented by Icann.org, some are still to be implemented, or back to the sub Pro, or WG, or SO/AC to develop.

Sometimes this recommendations sounds very good (more transparency => more reviews => more work for us), can we, as a volunteer community commit to this work?

Or, maintaining a Good level of review to a manageable time/work is still transparent enough?



Triage: some recommendations have a long time on the table, but maybe irrelevant now. Or have changed from the original versión to a newest versión, because still important but not clarly adopted or implemented.

Focus: Can we handle all?

Time Planning: maybe not, but we can try to stablish a time planning to review most of it, yes sure, this a train that doesn't stop
