I currently serve as a coach for the EPOKA law students team competing at the JESSUP Moot Court Competition 2021. I have served as an ICANN NextGen Ambassador at ICANN63. I also have experience working as a trainer at the Central Elections Commission.

Strong written and verbal communication skills

My job and activities both as an academic as well as while serving as advisor to the Minister of Justice of Albania during 2019-2020 are strongly related with high written and verbal communication skills: I have drafted several reports, research papers, legal analyses, etc. I have several publications in leading international journals and several conference presentations and moderations.
