ICANN68 – Focus on Policy Development Process

About ICANN68

Supporting Organizations (SOs) and Advisory Committees (ACs) took the lead in designing the program for the four-day meeting, held 22 – 25 June 2020. Three plenary sessions set the trend for policy discussion that took place:

- a. DNS Abuse and malicious registrations
- b. The DNS and the Internet of Things
- c. Advancing policy discussions amid the COVID-19 pandemic

Apart from the above, there were substantial discussions on SubPro as well. ccNSO hosted Tech Day sessions and ALAC hosted a comprehensive session on IDNs and UA also. The Governmental Advisory Committee (GAC) was very active – with a plenary session and meetings with other SO and ACs.

What was new?

- a. Expanded agenda for Prep Sessions, held 8 – 18 June 2020.
- b. Virtual interpretation platform in six UN languages: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish.

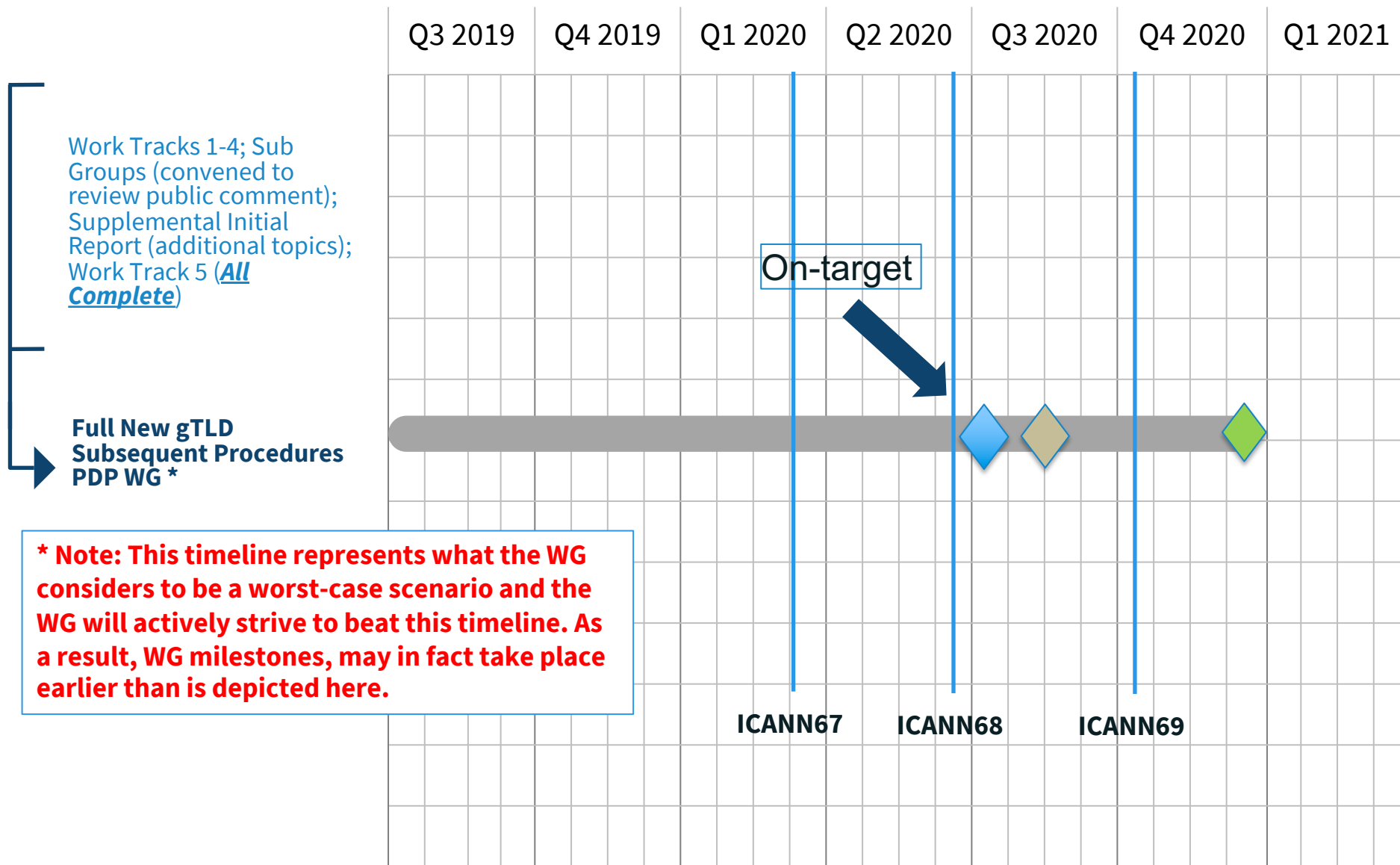
What meetings were held at ICANN68

What are the current challenges and issues?

- The entire draft Final Report will be published for public comment, (at ICANN68 we had planned by end July this has been revised now to Aug) the WG will need to set expectations that new information is welcomed, *not just restating positions*
- While the WG has made strides in developing draft Final Recommendations, including for challenging topics (e.g., closed generics, predictability framework, string contention resolution, etc.), some of these topics may not be able to achieve consensus.

But we are making enough progress in some areas to rationalise the additional time being currently devoted to this effort pre Publication, though it should be expected some particular issues will be called out for wider Community comment on these topics in the Final Report

DNS Abuse: COVID-19 and End User issues

Impact on End users

- Awareness of the enhanced part the Internet has played in people's lives
- Ability to maintain contacts through online communication – but raised awareness of the issues of access to those communications
- Misuse of online communications: frauds, scams, criminality
- Privacy – including use of 'tracing' apps

Impact of the ICANN Multi-stakeholder model

- New ways for communities to engage, to participate – BUT
- Loss of opportunities for education, engagement
- Recognition that end users are local, hard to reach, hard to engage

DNS Abuse

Setting an Acceptable Threshold

Objective Measures of DNS Abuse, Drew Bagley, Secure Domain Foundation

- Was part of CCT review process - concern on systemic, unabated abuse by particular registrars, no action by registry, ICANN compliance

What Can DAAR Tell Us, David Conrad, CTO, ICANN

- ICANN using two measures for abuse: DAAR (Domain Activity Abuse Reporting) and 'health indicator' reports on abuse. Abuse generally going down, but do see some outliers

What data do Registrars Collect, Graeme Bunton, Manager Public Policy Tucows

- Need to understand economics of registries: high volume, low margins. Don't automatically collect data on abuse. Need definition of abuse, and identify small number of bad actors

PICS and PICDRP: How to get them right

Consumer Expectations: Laureen Kaplan, Federal Trade Commission

- Customer expectations of connection between name and website/expectations will be enforced. Issues of compliance mechanisms and time lag for enforceability

Compliance' Role in PICs: Jamie Hedlund, ICANN Compliance

- Role of Compliance including audits and complaint handling

PICDRP and PICs: Richard Hill, former member, PICDRP

- DRP mechanism is fact finding: enforcement by ICANN. Mechanism takes time and money

Does the System work for applicants and end users: Brian Winderfeld, Winderfeld Group

- Procedural deficiencies and extended timeframe for complaint resolution

New gTLD Applicants: Expanding the Circle

Bias against Niche TLD Applicants: Edmon Chung – DotKids

- Lack of outreach, aversion to ‘gaming’, application contradictory, lack of support apart from applicant fee, etc

Bias against Niche TLD Applicants: Constantine Roussos – DotMusic

- Expensive, scoring entirely subjective, untrained evaluators, narrow interpretation of ‘community’

Applicant Support: Christa Taylor

- Need for increased awareness, communication, longer lead times, expanded mediums of communication, regional experts

Community Priority Evaluation: Justice Chew ALAC

- Improvements in applicant support program, greater participation in community priority evaluation selection of service provider, reform of CPE processes, criteria and guidelines

Aligning Universal Acceptance (UA) and IDNs with the Multilingual Internet

UA and EAI Challenges in African Communities: Hadia El Miniawi, At-Large

- Benefits for Africa: Use of local scripts, promoting economic opportunity, inclusion,, digital identity. Challenges: infrastructure, lack of web content, lack or awareness.

UA: The European Experience - Roberto Gaetano, At-Large

- Technological issues, cultural, economic benefits of communications in own scripts

UA Adoption by Industry: enablers & impediments, and Support Required from At-Large - Dennis Tan, Verisign/UASG

UA and the Multilingual Internet: Opportunities and Challenges - Edmon Chung, DotAsia

- Challenges of US and what is needed

Addressing US Readiness: Sarmad Hussain, ICANN

- Vision: all names, email addresses work in all software applications. Issues are newer names, longer TLDs, IDNs. Technological assistance available

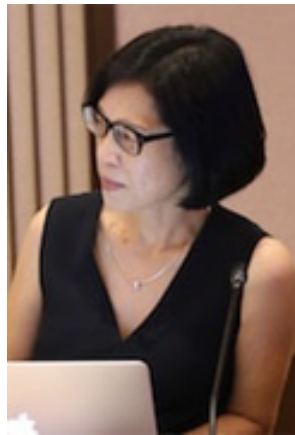
