## **ALAC Chair Update**

Hello APRALO community,

One event that I hope many of you were able to take advantage of at the end of February was the APRICOT meeting. This is the <u>Asia Pacific Regional Internet Conference on Operational Technologies</u>, <u>held this year from 22 February to 4 March</u>. Its programme each year includes a week of technical training and a week of conference. Its two organisers are APNOG and APNIC (Asia Pacific Network Operators Group and Asia Pacific Network Information Centre). APNIC is the Regional Internet Registry (RIR) for the Asia Pacific region, responsible for the management and distribution of Internet Number

Resources (IP addresses and AS numbers). APRICOT is one of two meetings that APNIC formally participates in during the year. This year APRICOT was supposed to be held in the Philippines but, of course, like ICANN70, it went virtual. In 2020 I attended APRICOT in Melbourne, the first and only meeting of 2020 for many of us.

And of course, February was certainly a month of readying ourselves for the upcoming ICANN70 meeting at the end of March. Although it is a short meeting of only four days, there is quite a lot to engage us from At-Large. Of particular interest is that LACRALO is holding its General Assembly and I'd like to see some of our members supporting the activities of LACRALO during ICANN70. If you were at the ALAC meeting this month, you would have been able to trial the new interpretation tool that is being offered at the next ICANN meeting. At-Large was first to trial it, so that if there were glitches, we identified them and helped the technical team to sort them out before the ICANN meeting. I found myself without sound at one stage because I used a feature incorrectly. Lesson learned. The great thing is that we in At-Large have helped to make a difference. Like a dripping tap, we requested on several occasions an easy to use interpretation tool for use with zoom, for the large communities of people who don't have English as their first language. For most of ICANN these are French and Spanish speakers. For APRALO, they offer Chinese and although it is not used as much by At-Large, I am assuming it is used quite a bit in other areas of ICANN.

So, there is a lot happening, and we hope you are continuing to get involved where you can. I hope to see more of you in our At-Large working groups, as well as in the APRALO policy working groups that are being established. Take care.

## **ICANN Update**

In February 2021, ICANN:

- Published the FY21 Q2 Unaudited Financial Results for <u>ICANN</u> and <u>PTI</u>.
- Announced the <u>prep week schedule</u> for ICANN70. The prep week will be organised from 8-11 March and consist of ten sessions.
- Register for ICANN70 Virtual Community Forum to attend these sessions.

## **ALAC Update**

At the ALAC monthly call on <u>23 February</u>, <u>Christina Rodriguez</u>, Sr. Director, Language Services, and <u>Sara Caplis</u>, Manager, Meetings Technical Services from ICANN demonstrated and provided an overview of the Zoom Interpretation Features, a feature that was appreciated by most participants.

<u>John Crain</u>, Chief Security, Stability & Resiliency Office, ICANN was the Guest Speaker of the month and provided an overview of the <u>Domain Abuse Activity Reporting</u> (DAAR) 2.0., the initiatives taken so far, the DAAR review process and also responded to questions from the audience.



In addition, updates were shared on the 2021 At-Large activities and initiative. Maureen provided information about the ICANN's FY23 Strategic Outlook Activities and how the At-Large Plus leadership would participate in an upcoming trends session; ALAC Liaison to GNSO Council Cheryl Langdon-Orr updated on developments from the GNSO Council.

An update was provided on the ALAC policy development activities.nAdditionally, ICANN Staff Gisella Gruber and Maureen provided an update on ICANN70 and At Large Plans and Lilian Ivete de Luque Bruges provided information on the Social Media plans for ICANN70.

#### **APRALO Update**

The <u>APRALO monthly call</u> was held on 18 February and chaired by APRALO Chair Satish Babu. During the call the ALAC policy update was shared by Justine Chew. She shared an overview on the ALAC statement on Draft FY22-26 Operating & Financial Plan and Draft FY22 Operating Plan & Budget; spoke briefly spoke on the ALAC Advice to the ICANN Board on Subsequent Procedures; Second Security, Stability, and Resiliency (SSR2) Review Team Final Report and EU Directive on Security of Network and Information Systems (NIS 2 Directive).

Maureen Hilyard provided an update on ICANN70 highlighting the policy sessions. She also shared the update of .PIR setting up the <a href="DNS Abuse">DNS Abuse</a> institute New Institute to combat DNS Abuse.

For the first time there was a guest speaker who spoke on the implications of the changes in the privacy policy for end users. More details of the talk is shared in the next section.

Ali Almeshal elaborated on the APRALO mentorship program proposal.

Elaborating on the NomCom leadership positions, Amrita Choudhury encouraged community members to apply and/or encourage people from APAC especially women to apply for the positions.

#### **APRALO Talk**

For the first time during the APRALO monthly, guest speaker <u>Nikhil Pahwa</u>, Founder and editor of Medianama, spoke on the topic "End user implications on the privacy policy" from the changes in the

WhatsApp policy. In his talk he provided an overview on the announced changes by WhatsApp in its privacy policy, the reactions and concerns of various stakeholders and misinformation surrounding the change in privacy policy. He highlighted the differential approach in privacy policy of Facebook/ WhatsApp between different nations such as between the EU and India. Nikhil highlighted the need for more notices before policies are implemented; more details on how data will be used by companies and further deliberation on scope of data minimization.

Members of APRALO shared their comments and views on the topic during the interactive part of the discussion, that include the pervasive nature of the new policy changes; highlighting the need to maintain trust in a relationship; providing an opportunity to end users to read the fine print of such significant change in policy etc.

On 25 February 2021 the Internet Society Armenia Chapter and the Internet Society Accessibility Special Interest Group (Accessibility SIG) convened a meeting with the theme 'Accessibility Challenges: A conversation with ISOC Armenia'.

ISOC Armenia has been working on accessibility issues for many years and has won several grants and prizes for the work done with and for the people with disabilities.

The meeting gathered around 30 participants who learned about the projects implemented. In particular

about the Internet Availability Center of Blind and Visually Impaired People, the Internet Radio for People with Visual Impairments, a tool for Autistic Children and Children with social anxiety and an AAC App for Armenian non-verbal individuals.

One of the invited speakers was a school girl, who represented the App she created with her schoolmates to help autistic children interact with others. ISOC Armenia strongly encourages participation of youth and females into its activities and promotes diverse projects that help the local community to overcome challenges.

The meeting was very interactive with availability of real time text feature.




#### AP\* Retreat on 28 February 2021
