### **APRALO Chair Update**

Dear APRALO Community -

### Greetings!

We are now approaching one more ICANN Virtual Meeting, the ICANN71 Policy Forum. The Policy Forum Prep Week has concluded last week, and the ICANN71 proper begins next week on 14 June 2021. I request all of our community members to register for ICANN71 if you haven't already done so, and to participate in the sessions.

We have several interesting sessions scheduled for the ICANN meeting, including End-User Participation in ICANN PDPs and the role of End-Users in the ICANN Ecosystem; Governmental Regulatory Developments and their impact on ICANN; ccTLD Governance Models; GDPR and its policy implications; ICANN and the Internet Governance Ecosystem; new gTLDS and Protection of Geographical names; and Understanding Block Lists. There are also sessions such as the Welcome session where the At-Large Talking Points will be discussed, the Wrap-up session on Thursday; the EURALO Social Event and the joint AFRALO-AfrICANN session.

APRALO came out with its own <u>statement</u> on Subsequent Procedures Final Outputs, generally supporting the positions of the ALAC submission but also raising additional regional priorities. The statement was arrived at after a community process led by Justine Chew as part of the APRALO Policy Forum. I hope that the Policy Forum will be able to take on more activities of this kind in future.

APRALO is in process of electing its officers. Currently, voting is under way for the APRALO NomCom Delegate whose name will be recommended to the ALAC. The APRALO Mentoring Program is also under way, and we will be working on the applications to short-list applicants over the next couple of weeks.

The global pandemic is still holding sway over much of Asia-Pacific, but may be losing its intensity given the increasing vaccinations and following of protocols. I hope each of us and our families stays safe.

# **ALAC Chair Update**

Dear APRALO members -

Although it was still a month away, ICANN71 filled our thoughts and meeting times. May was filled with

weekly gatherings of the At-Large Planning Committee seeking ideas and volunteers who would be willing to coordinate sessions for ICANN71. This involved lots of discussion about topics, potential participants, questions and talking points to ensure that we get across the end-user perspective on whatever issues are being raised. I believe that what we have planned for ICANN71 shows a diversity of participation from within At-Large but I would like to have seen APRALO ownership in at least one of the sessions as we have in the past. As the ALAC Chair I was very pleased with the encouragement towards policy discussion that Justine initiated with regards to the APRALO statement on Subsequent Procedures. This was an example of a topic that had the potential for developing into a session for an ICANN meeting - especially around applicant support for new gTLDs in developing regions like our own where participation was minimal. However, thanks to Justine and those who participated in the development of the statement on behalf of APRALO, it was a positive start within the area of policy discussion from our region.

Also I was very pleased that we were able to get two volunteers from the APRALO region into the team that is part of the GNSO Policy Development Process (PDP) on the Transfer of Domains. While technical knowledge of inter-registrar transfers was a strong requirement, it was good to get Siva Muthusamy and K Mohan Raidu onto the group which works uniquely on this topic. Everyone who was selected, whether member, alternate or observer, contributes to the discussions at the Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG) meetings, which is an innovation in itself within At-Large. Therefore, APRALO is getting involved at that level, which is really pleasing to see but it would be good to get more of our voices heard at the CPWG. I note that there is a new call for participants to apply for member, alternate and observer positions for an Expedited PDP on IDNs. This will require some experience in Internationalised Domain Names but this is a topic area where APRALO could and should have some representation. Our region has led IDN discussions in the past, although it would be good to see some fresh faces involved in the development of policy at ICANN level in this area as well.

But I look forward to at least seeing APRALO participants attending ICANN71 even though some of the times of the sessions are quite awful for us. I hope you can manage to support the At-Large sessions at least. And in the meantime, please take care as the world continues to deal with the pandemic. I hope you are all getting vaccinated so please keep safe and healthy.

- The annual Service Organization Control (SOC) audit <u>confirmed</u> that ICANN org has the appropriate controls in place for IANA functions.
- Received the Final Declaration of the Independent Review Process (IRP) regarding .WEB.
- Published the <u>updated</u> domain name marketplace indicators.
- Published the ICANN71 Prep Week schedule.
- <u>Issued a request for proposal</u> (RFP) to identify a contractor qualified to conduct research on Domain Name System Security Extensions (DNSSEC) deployment across the Internet.
- <u>Selected PDR Ltd. d/b/a PublicDomainRegistry.com (IANA 303) (PDR) to support and manage the registered users</u> of the De-accredited Net 4 India Limited (IANA 1007) (Net 4 India).

### **APRALO Policy Forum Update**

### **APRALO ALAC Member, Justine Chew**

Having settled several foundational aspects of the APRALO Register of Skills & Interests (RoSI) Project, the project's small team members are now engaged in developing their work scope. Project progress and discussions are updated periodically at the <a href="Project RoSI Work Space">Project RoSI Work Space</a>.

At its May 2021 Monthly Call, RALO members in attendance resolved to submit an APRALO Statement in response to the GNSO New gTLD Subsequent Procedures Final Outputs for ICANN Board Consideration public comment proceedings which closes on 1 June 2021. It was also determined that such a statement, while expressing a full endorsement of the ALAC Advice on Subsequent Procedures that was submitted to the ICANN Board on 16 April 2021, should in particular, highlight APRALO's call for action which to increase adoption of Universal Acceptance (UA) and Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs); a further call for the increased and equitable access by "Global South", community / niche TLD applicants through the Applicant Support Program (ASP) and Community Priority Evaluation (CPE) as well as opposition to private auctions as a permissible mechanism for resolving contention sets; and APRALO's backing for the ALAC to be granted automatic standing to file Community Objections in Subsequent Procedures, against applications for strings found to be problematic through an established RALO-driven process. A small team of penholders were conscripted to produce the intended statement for prompt submission; please visit the APRALO Policy Forum wiki page to check on the status of this statement.

# **APRALO Update**

The monthly APRALO Call was held on 20 May. At the call, Justine Chew provided the policy update, highlighting that the ALAC Advice to the ICANN Board is still to be discussed on the EPDP Phase 2 Policy Recommendations for Board Consideration and that ALAC is presently ratifying statement for GNSO Review of All Rights Protection Mechanisms in All gTLDs Policy Development Process Phase 1 Final Recommendations for ICANN Board Consideration.

Leon Sanchez shared updates of the Board activities including the clearance of the Additional budget by the board, approval of the GAC communique of ICANN70, etc. He updated that the Board passed resolutions in consent agenda and finalised the June workshop.

Roberto Gaetano spoke to the community on the Unaffiliated Individual Members (UIM) Working Party Final Report.

Maureen provided an update on ICANN71, which includes, model of APRALO policy forum, the straw poll conducted if there is a need for an APRALO subsequent procedures statement.

An update on the <u>APRALO mentorship program</u> was provided by Ali. Satish provided an update on enhancing APRALO.

Gisella provided an update on the 2021 APRALO elections. While Amrita Choudhury provided an update on the NomCom applications.

### **APRALO Talk**

This month the guest speaker was Roberto Gaetano. Roberto spoke to the community on the <u>Unaffiliated Individual Members (UIM) Working Party Final Report</u> which included update on the working party formation and process; identification of the issues that need to be addressed, issues related to terminologies, rough consensus, voting rights, things to be considered for followup action and discussion which the WG listed.

Questions were raised on what the next steps in terms of implementation will be. Cheryl clarified that At Large review implementation group will look after the recommendations of the WG and work with the leadership.
