History

Governmental representatives meet in comfortable rooms

- Civil Society activists demonstrate outside
 - Policemen try to prevent them from approaching the building
 - Confrontations ► Injuries
 - death
- Millennium Summit
 - Invite these noisy activists to the meeting room
 - First experience: WSIS

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

Summit ► Head of States and Governments ► Governmental by definition

■ Civil Society: Observer with Private Sector and Int. Organizations

- Written contributions

- Speak for 5 min at the end

- No decision making right

■ Not a full Multi-stakeholder model

- Permitted to impact the final outputs

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

Civil Society got organized

■ Civil Society Bureau

● Composed of 22 members representing 22 Families

- Academia
- Science & Technology
- NGOs
- Media
- Etc.

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

Civil Society got organized

■ Civil Society Bureau

● In charge of all organizational aspects

- Form of contribution
- Lobbying
- Meetings and gatherings

● Holds a daily Plenary during the F2F PreComs and Summits

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

Civil Society got organized

■ Content & Themes Group

- In charge of preparing the substantial contributions
 - Works through a mailing list
 - Builds consensus on the Civil Society contributions
 - Holds a daily plenary during the F2F gatherings
- Permitted to impact the final outputs

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

Technical Summit

- Civil Society ► Social & Human Dimensions
 - Influenced the official declarations of Summit
 - Issued its own ones

- Civil Society ► Fully participated in the inter-summit work
 - Working Group on Internet Governance (WGIG)
 - Task Force on Financial Mechanisms to reduce the Digital divide

World Summit on Information Society (WSIS)

■ Tunis Agenda:

72. We ask the UN Secretary-General to convene a meeting of the new forum for multi-stakeholder policy dialogue called the **Internet Governance Forum (IGF)**.

Internet Governance Forum (IGF)

Natively Multi-Stakeholder

- Full Multi-Stakeholder model
 - Multi-Stakeholder Advisory Group (MAG)
 - All official sessions
 - Evaluation Criterion of proposed workshops
- Not a decision making Forum
 - No Multi-Stakeholder decision making process

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names & Numbers (ICANN)

■ Composed of:

- Board of Directors (Decision)
- Staff
- Community
 - Governments
 - End Users
 - Domain Name actors
 - IP Address actors
 - Protocol Parameters developers

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names & Numbers (ICANN)

■ Community:

● Supporting Organizations (Develop Policies)

- Country Code Names Supporting Organization (ccNSO)
- Generic Names Supporting Organization (GNSO)
- Address Supporting Organization (ASO)

● Advisory Committees (Give advices to the ICANN Board)

- Governmental Advisory Committee (GAC)
- At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC)
- Security & Stability Advisory Committee (SSAC)
- Root Servers System Advisory Committee (RSSAC)

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names & Numbers (ICANN)

■ Policy Development Process

- Supporting Organization Develop a Policy
- The Policy is put for Public comment
- The SO recommends to the Board the updated Policy
- The updated Policy is put for Public comment
- Advisory committees give their advices (if any) to the Board
- The Board decides

Internet Corporation for Assigned Names & Numbers (ICANN)

- Unique Identifiers Stewardship transition (Oct. 2016)
 - Stewardship transition from the NTIA (USG) to Community
 - New Accountability Mechanisms
 - New Powers to the Community
 - Reject the Budget
 - Remove a Board Director
 - Remove the whole Board directors together
 - Etc.
 - Decision making process in ICANN more multi-stakeholder

Conclusion

- Multi-Stakeholder approach
 - Applied in different environments
 - Not a unique Multi-Stakeholder model
 - Not always the same stakeholders
 - It's essentially about
 - Active participation and contribution from all
 - Working together with less hierarchy
