Unique Names and Numbers

Anything connected to the Internet – including computers, mobile phones, and other devices – has a unique number called an IP address. IP stands for Internet Protocol.





This address is like a postal address. It allows messages, videos, and other packets of data to be sent from anywhere on the Internet to the device that has been uniquely identified by its IP address.

IP addresses can be difficult to remember, so instead of numbers, the Internet's Domain Name System uses letters, numbers, and hyphens to form a name that is easier to remember.





Mission, Values, and Role



ICANN's Mission

The mission of the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) is to ensure the stable and secure operation of the Internet's unique identifier systems

Specifically, ICANN:



Coordinates the allocation and assignment of names in the root zone of the Domain Name System



Coordinates the development and implementation of policies concerning the registration of second-level domain names in generic top-level domains (gTLDs)



Facilitates the coordination of the operation and evolution of the DNS root name server system



Coordinates the allocation and assignment at the top-most level of Internet Protocol numbers and Autonomous System numbers

Collaborates with other bodies as appropriate to provide registries needed for the functioning of the Internet as specified by Internet protocol standards development organizations

Fellowship

A global capacity development program to support ICANN's multistakeholder community. The online application process is open three times a year to participate in an ICANN Public Meeting (Policy Forum meeting for Alumni only).



NextGen

A regionally based program to create awareness and promote future discussions within universities and other regional forums. The online application process is open three times a year to attend an ICANN Public Meeting.

Newcomer

A program dedicated to those entering the ICANN community. Options are available for selfstudy using the newcomer web page or participating in person or remotely at the Newcomer Day/Newcomer Session at an ICANN Public Meeting.

The **Fellowship Program** focuses on global capacity development to support diversity and active involvement in ICANN's multistakeholder community. The online application process is open three times a year. Candidates must be at least 21 years of age and there is no age cap to participate. The **NextGen@ICANN program** focuses on education, awareness, and future engagement. Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 30 and live and be enrolled in some type of higher learning curriculum in the region where the ICANN Public Meeting is being held.



Fellowship Program | At-a-glance


- Global capacity development program to support ICANN's multistakeholder community

- Up to 40 fellows selected for each round; 5 mentors appointed by SOs/ACs
- An important source for identifying potential, active, new community participants, and for further honing the skills of returning program participants

Within this scope, there are specific target audiences based on age, gender, regional location, to name but a few characteristics, that are representative of a broad spectrum of regionally and sector diverse individuals, focused on but not limited to: citizens of low, lower-middle, or upper-middle income economies with backgrounds or interests in government, information and communications technology (ICT), academia, civil society and business. In addition, potential leaders in their relevant fields who are likely to be force-multipliers; businesses and organizations that seek to engage with this target group; regional organizations who organize capacity building and/or skills-based training to the next generation; colleges, schools, or universities.




NextGen@ICANN Program | At-a-glance



- Important source for identifying potential new community participants and for bringing new perspectives from universities across the world
- Up to 12 slots per ICANN meeting to individuals who are living and studying within the region where the ICANN meeting is taking place
- 3 Additional previous NextGen serve as Mentors
- Participants are encouraged to share ICANN information after the meeting with their universities in conjunction with their GSE regional representatives


