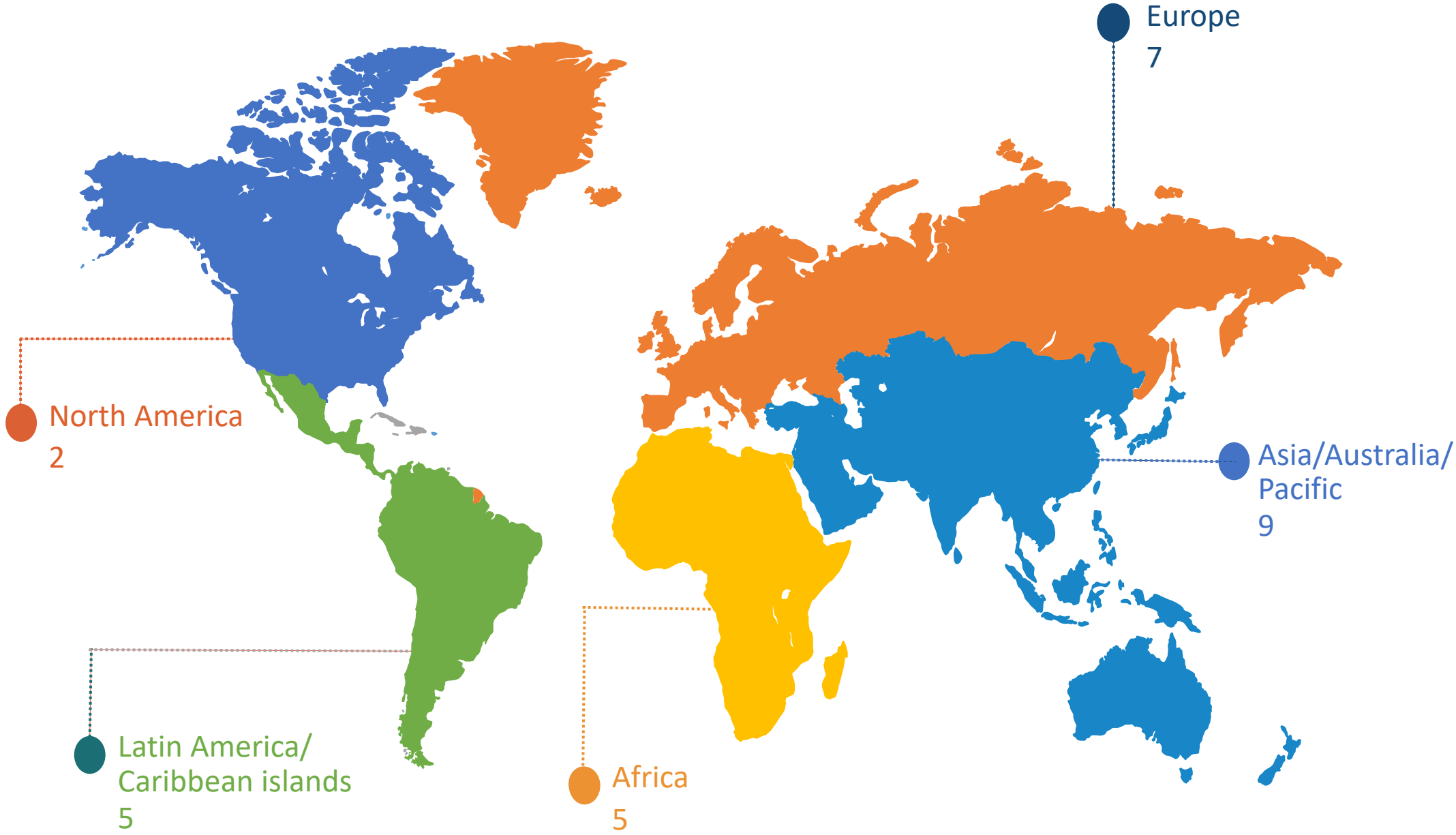

- form a small subgroup in charge of organising IGLC session at public ICANN
- Propose balanced views on IG
- having requests from CCNSO Council or members to work on topics (recognition of the group's value)
- Involve and respect voices of developing countries and less developed regions. Especially currently they are 'decided' by the leading countries and stakeholders.

External

- liaise with other groups working on IG
- increased participation in IGLC issues from ccTLD managers and
- Stimulate and capture the interest of ccTLD managers and community towards IG topics
- Provide a multistakeholder output on topics
- when we are formally contributing to the IGF as a platform for all ccTLD issues
- list and quality of experts and people invited to present during IGLC meeting, or contribute by writing
- Follow up the main topics concerned and publish a series of outcomes and questions remained.
- will we perhaps at a later stage have measures of progress specific to the IGLC topics not just the IGLC work in general?
