- **The Steering committee** is looking forward to the draft. Merike Käo, Göran Marby, David Conrad, John Crain, and Sally Newell Cohen will be meeting next week to discuss the review process for the report.
- **ICANN DNS Symposium (IDS) Submission** - Merike Käo submitted a panel proposal for the upcoming DNS Symposium. ICANN staff will contact the TSG members who volunteered to participate to determine a suitable time for the session and coordinate that with the IDS program committee.
- **Continuing recommendation discussion** - The TSG discussed several recommendations:
 - education and outreach campaigns, including participating and funding projects that increase community awareness
 - promoting DNSSEC and related standards
 - develop, or encourage to be developed, tools that would help organizations harden their DNS-related infrastructure
 - identifying where policy should be developed through appropriate policy-making processes
 - helping reduce the friction around appropriate credential management
- **Next steps:** The TSG will focus on the language and format of one recommendation to serve as a model for all others. ICANN staff will focus on categorizing the proposed recommendations to consolidate and bring them into alignment.

Action Items

1. ICANN staff will contact the TSG members who volunteered to participate to determine a suitable time for the session and coordinate that with the IDS program committee.
2. ICANN staff will focus on one topic area and draft a complete recommendation. The TSG will review the structure and tone of the recommendation so that it may serve as a template for all other recommendations.
3. ICANN staff will categorize the proposed recommendations and suggest where they might be consolidated.
