 Those whose interests lie with those who provide Internet and domain name registrations and services, domain name registrants and content, and service providers.

What We Do

Consider and provide input and advice on ICANN activities as they relate to the interests of individual Internet users. This includes policies developed by Supporting Organizations, ICANN organization operations, and other issues for which community input and advice is appropriate.

How We Do It
