What is ICANN?

ICANN's Mission

The mission of the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers (ICANN) is to **ensure the stable and secure operation of the Internet's unique identifier systems**

Specifically, ICANN:

-  **1** Coordinates the allocation and assignment of names in the root zone of the Domain Name System
-  **2** Coordinates the development and implementation of policies concerning the registration of second-level domain names in generic top-level domains (gTLDs)
-  **3** Facilitates the coordination of the operation and evolution of the DNS root name server system
-  **4** Coordinates the allocation and assignment at the top-most level of Internet Protocol numbers and Autonomous System numbers
-  **5** Collaborates with other bodies as appropriate to provide registries needed for the functioning of the Internet as specified by Internet protocol standards development organizations

Unique Names and Numbers

Anything connected to the Internet – including computers, mobile phones and other devices – has a unique number called its IP address. IP stands for Internet Protocol.

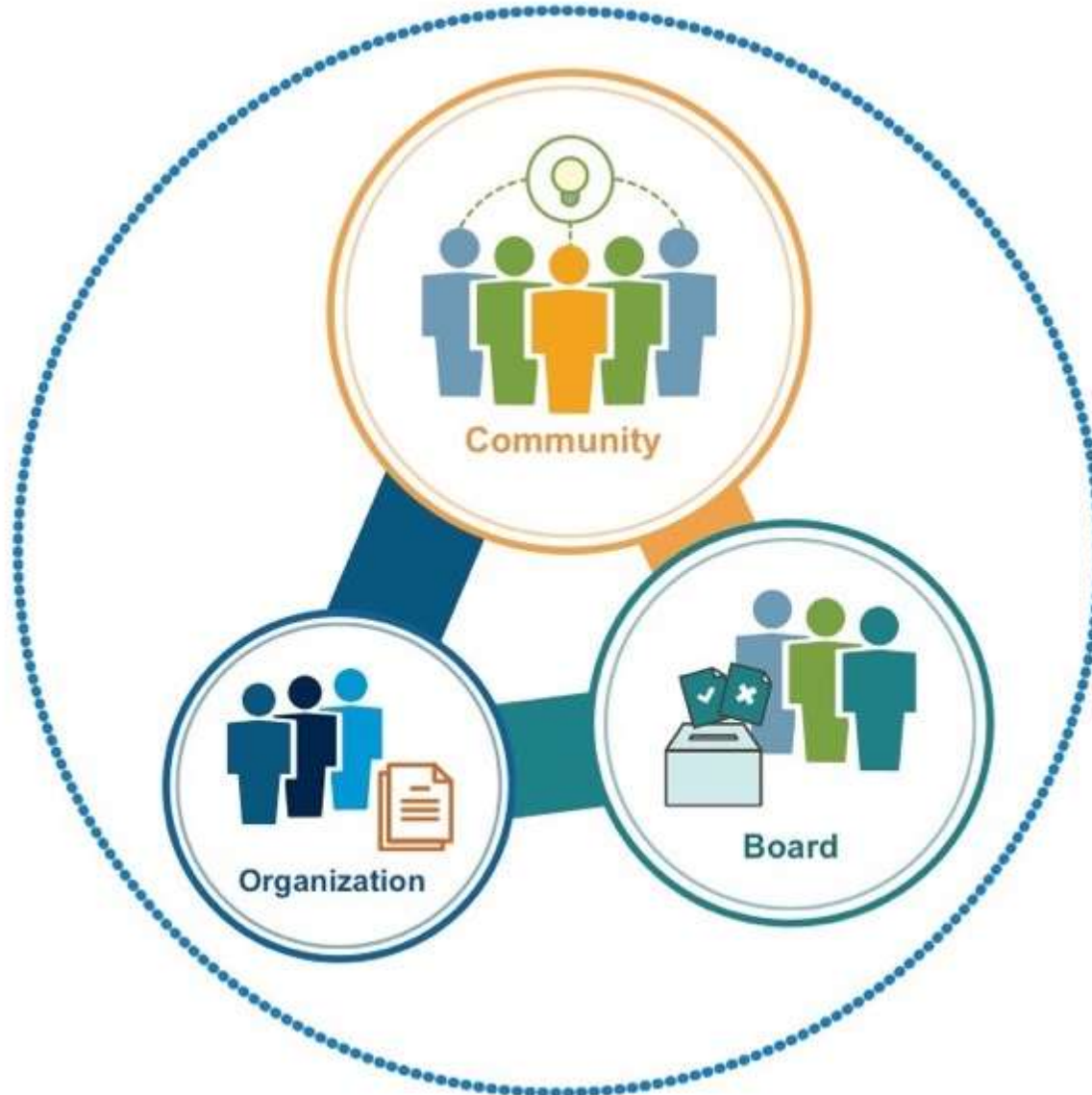


This address is like a postal address. It allows messages, videos and other packets of data to be sent from anywhere on the Internet to the device that has been uniquely identified by its IP address.

IP addresses can be difficult to remember, so instead of numbers, the Internet's domain name system uses letters, numbers and hyphens, to form a name that is easier to remember.

The ICANN Multistakeholder Community

MAKING POLICY:

Three Supporting Organizations (SOs) in the ICANN community are responsible for developing policy recommendations in the areas they represent: IP addresses; generic top-level domains (gTLDs); and country code top-level domains (ccTLDs).



PROVIDING ADVICE:

Four Advisory Committees (ACs) give advice and make recommendations on ICANN topics. The ACs are made up of representatives from: governments and international treaty organizations; root server operators; Internet security experts; and Internet end users.



Supporting Organizations (SOs)



ASO

The ASO Address Council is composed of 15 members — three from each of the Regional Internet Registries (RIRs) — who work on global Internet Protocol (IP) Address Policy.



ccNSO

The ccNSO (Council and members) works on global policies relating to country code top-level domain name (ccTLD) policies (e.g., .br, .uk).



GNSO

The GNSO Council is composed of 21 members — divided into two houses (contracted and non-contracted parties) — who work on generic top-level domain name (gTLD) policies (e.g., .com, new gTLDs).

ALAC

The ALAC expresses the interests of the individual Internet user and is composed of 15 members: two from each of the five Regional At-Large Organizations (RALOs) and five appointed by the ICANN Nominating Committee. It is supported by At-Large Structures (ALSes).



GAC

The GAC provides advice on public policy issues, particularly on interactions with ICANN policy and national laws or international agreements.



RSSAC

The RSSAC advises on the operation, administration, security, and integrity of the Root Server System.



SSAC

The SSAC advises on matters related to the security and integrity of the Internet's naming and address allocation systems.

What is ALAC?

ALAC Role

The At-Large community and At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC) have a role in the development of ICANN policy and policy advice as mandated by the ICANN bylaws. The ALAC expresses the interests of individual Internet end users as part of policy development and in advice to the ICANN Board.

Under the ICANN Bylaws, the roles of the ALAC are to:

- **Consider and provide advice** on the activities of ICANN as they relate to the interests of individual Internet users. This includes policies created through SOs, as well as ICANN operations and many other issues for which community input and advice is appropriate;
- Play an important part in ICANN's **accountability mechanisms**;
- Coordinate some of ICANN's **outreach and engagement** efforts to individual Internet users.

At-Large Community members are empowered to draft position statements on behalf of the ALAC, comment on draft statements, and engage in policy-focused activities.

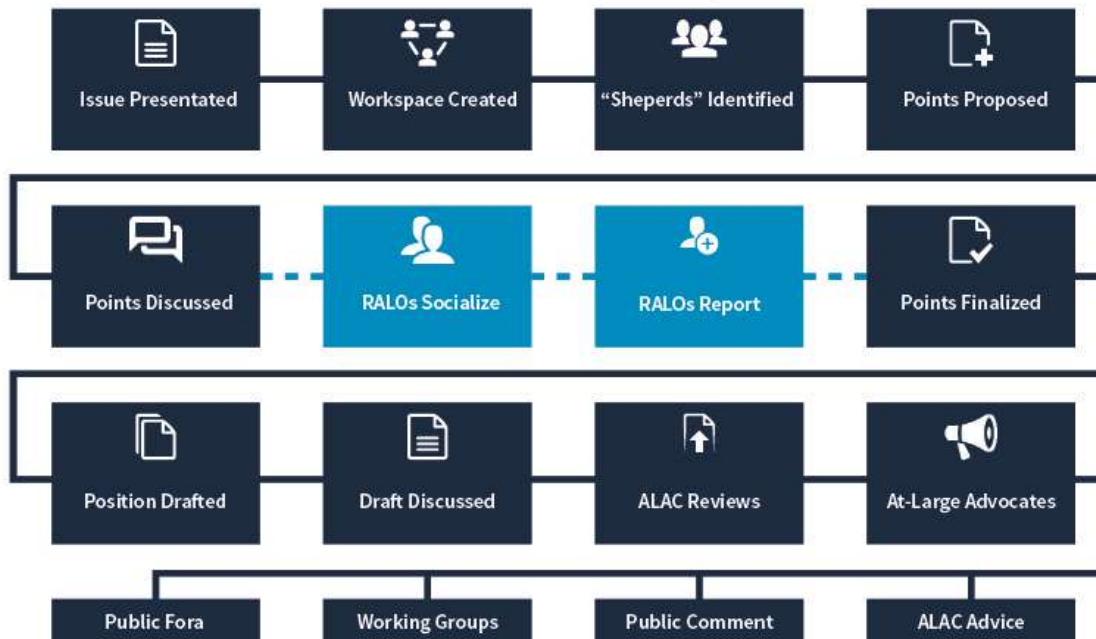

Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG)

The focus of the Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG), formed in December 2017, is directed towards policy comments and advice within At-Large, best practices for identifying Internet end user issues in the policy development process at ICANN, and engaging the At-Large community further on policy comments and advice.

At-Large Consolidated Policy Working Group (CPWG) Position Development Process

The CPWG Position Development Process illustrates the series of steps that guide a position on an ICANN policy topic of interest to a final statement, which is then forwarded to the At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC) for review.



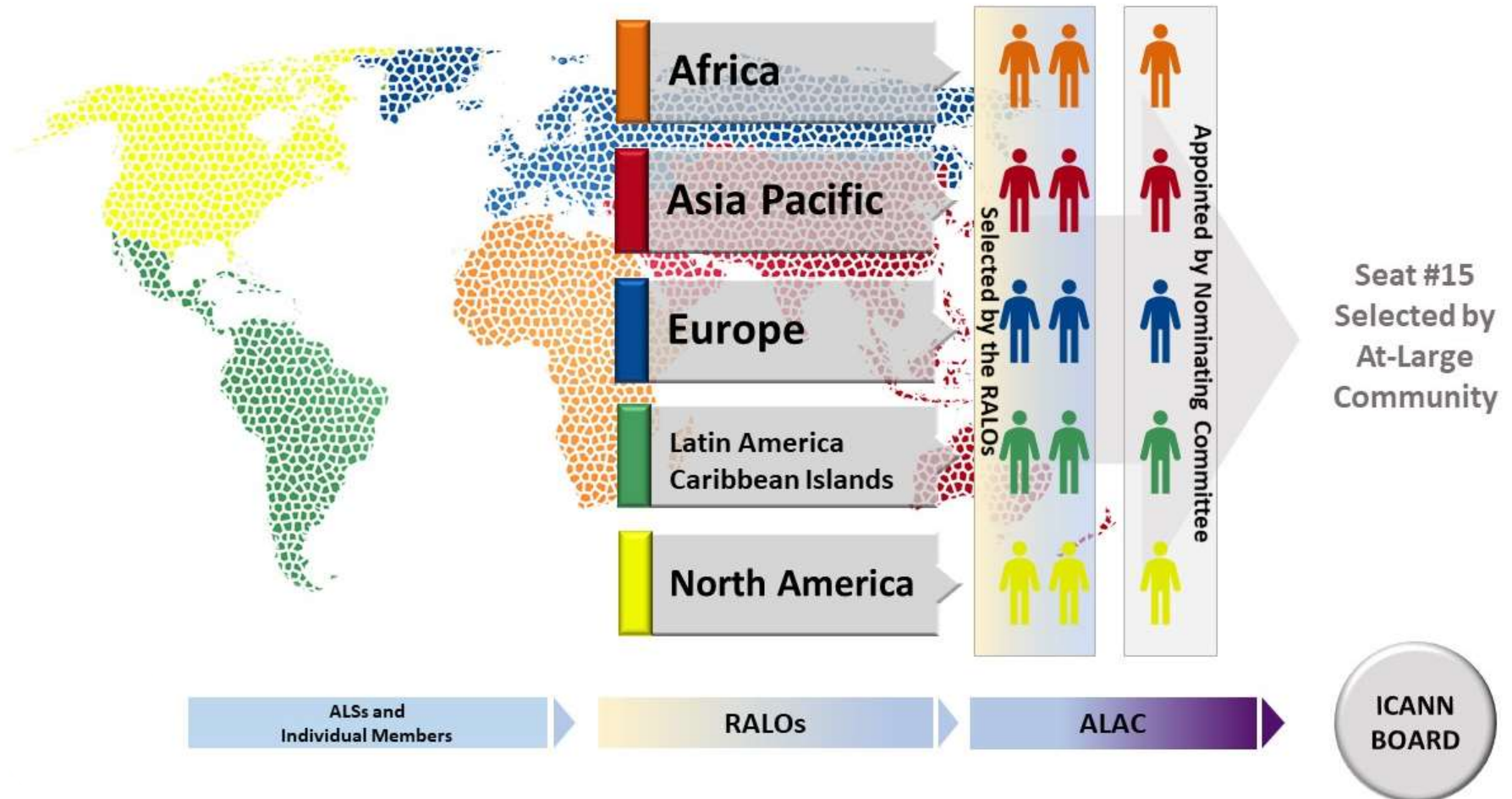
New people are welcome to join 90-minute weekly CPWG meetings on Wednesdays with rotating time at 13:00/19:00 UTC.

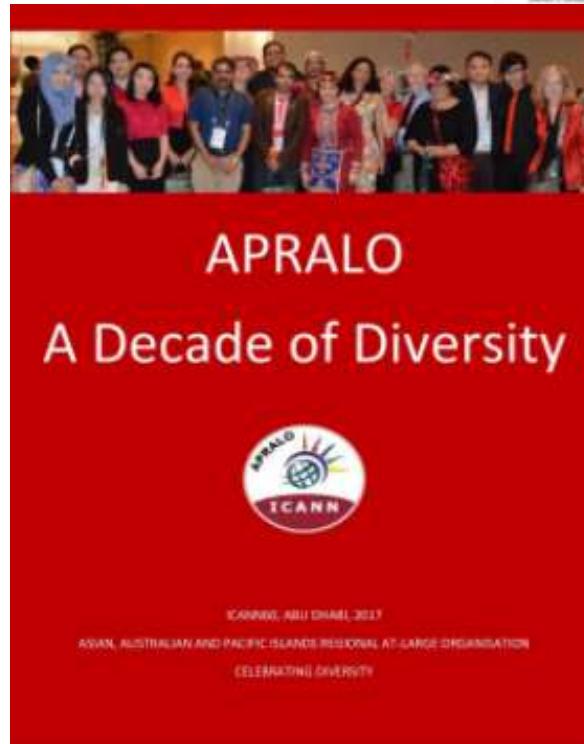

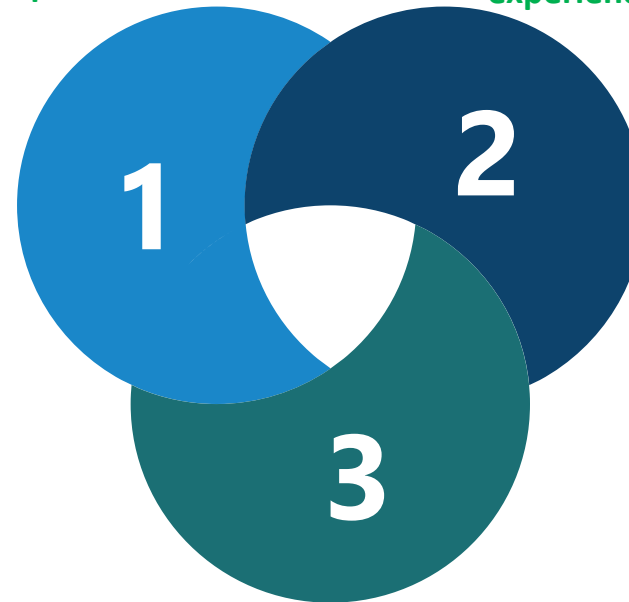


ICANN Learn

APRALO Members | Expectations

◆ Individual members are expected to:

- contribute to APRALO, ALAC and ICANN policy processes
- contribute to Outreach and Engagement within APRALO and their own communities
- contribute to APRALO's organisational development and decision-making processes

◆ ALS members are expected to:

- Encourage participation of their own members in APRALO's activities (similar to APRALO individual members)
- Participate in channeling views of their local communities into APRALO's policy development
- Participate in APRALO's decision-making processes (including elections)



ICANN Expected Standards of Behavior



Act in accordance with ICANN's Bylaws.

Treat all members of the ICANN community equally, irrespective of nationality, gender, racial or ethnic origin, religion or beliefs, disability, age, or sexual orientation; members of the ICANN community should treat each other with civility both face-to-face and online.

Respect all members of the ICANN community equally, behave in a professional manner and demonstrate appropriate behavior.

Listen to the views of all stakeholders when considering policy issues.

Act in a reasonable, objective and informed manner when participating in policy development and decision-making processes.

Work to build consensus with other stakeholders in order to find solutions to the issues that fall within the areas of ICANN's responsibility.

All participants are expected to conduct themselves on a professional level and will be held to the standards set forth in the [ICANN Community Anti-Harassment Policy and Terms of Participation](#) and Complaint Procedure and the [ICANN Expected Standards of Behavior](#).
