





Composition of the OISC

The OISC shall have minimum five (5) and maximum eight (8) members, plus up to four (4) representatives of the Regional Organizations (ROs). Membership of the OISC is open to all ccTLD managers (members and non-members of the ccNSO alike). At least four (4) of the members on the Committee should be members of the ccNSO Council, including one NomCom appointed Councillor. The ccNSO Meetings Programme Committee (MPC) Chair and Tech WG Chair should be a member as well. The ccNSO Council will appoint the members of the committee. In appointing members, the Council should take into account the need for a diverse Committee membership, including regional diversity.

Term of appointment

The term for the initially appointed members is for either one (1) year; two (2) years; or three (3) years. The ccNSO Council decides on the terms of the initially appointed members. After the initial appointment the regular term of appointment shall be three (3) years. Committee members are not eligible for re-appointment. Members may resign at any time if circumstances arise that prevent them from effectively performing their function. If a member resigns, the ccNSO Council may appoint a replacement, who will serve for the remainder of the period.
