Why do we need an update?

- Adopted in 2004
- Since 2004, the ccNSO membership grew from 40 in 2004 to 172 in 2022
- Changed environment: IDN ccTLDs, IANA Stewardship Transition and ccNSO as Decisional Participant
- Evolution of governance of the ccNSO: from only Rules in 2004, to the Rules and over 10 Guidelines in 2022

The new Rules are a result of extensive discussions and consultations with ccNSO members

- Governance sessions at ICANN public meetings since ICANN69, leading up to ICANN72 with near final set of proposals
- ccNSO Member survey
- Consultative webinars
- Comment period on members mailing list in December 2022

- The role of Members and Council for ccNSO as Decisional Participant
 - Extensive discussion regarding the role of Members and Council with respect to decision-making
 - Awaits completion of draft of relevant Operating Procedures (Guidelines)


What needs to happen, to replace the 2004 Rules? New proposed rules need to be adopted by
