Strategic Focus Area #2: Governance

"ICANN's multistakeholder model of governance, which grew to fit ICANN's needs, has the potential of becoming less effective and more expensive as it matures and scales up to respond to increasing needs of our community."

Key Trend Themes

- Efficiency and effectiveness of ICANN's multistakeholder model continue to be questioned.
- Continued necessity of fulfilling transparency and accountability, inclusiveness and openness obligations.
- Increasing pressure to work effectively and to make timely and efficient use of ICANN resources.

Proposed New Strategic Goal

2.3 Strengthen the inclusivity and openness of ICANN's multistakeholder model by improving and sustaining diverse representation and active, effective participation.

Case Study: EPDP "firsts" to improve efficiency and effectiveness

- Precision in Scoping the Work
 - Charter: A narrowly scoped Charter drafted by the entire GNSO Council
- Work Processes/Timing of decision-making
 - Timeline: Externally imposed deadline of 20 May 2019
- Roles and Responsibilities
 - EPDP Chair: Appointed by GNSO Council
 - Terms of participation: all team members had to sign up
- Representativeness and inclusiveness
 - EPDP Team composition: Representatives from GNSO, GAC, ALAC and SSAC
- Complexity
 - Training for EPDP Team: basic GDPR/privacy laws training
- Cost & Efficient Use of Resources
 - Resources and budget: US\$590K (actual: US\$428K)
