

Registrant Rights and Responsibilities

- ICANN Bylaws
 - In its Commitments and Core Values (Art. 1, Sect. 1.2), ICANN ensures an open, transparent and bottom-up multistakeholder policy development process that includes civil society and end users and that works to ascertain the global public interest.
- Registrant Rights in the Registrar Accreditation Agreement (RAA)
 - Contracts between ICANN-accredited registrars and ICANN.
 - Rights include access to information from the registrar regarding processes for registering, managing, transferring, renewing, and restoring domain name registrations.
- Registrants and Maintaining a Secure DNS
 - ICANN org has always recognized registrants, who are the individuals or entities that register and subsequently manage and maintain domain names that make up the DNS, as being essential to a robust, stable, and secure DNS and marketplace.
- Community Developed Policies that Impact Registrants
 - Include: WDRP, ERRP, Transfer Policy, URS, UDRP, and others.
- ICANN Org Registrant Program
 - Aims to educate registrants about their rights and responsibilities, the domain name ecosystem and how to navigate it, and the ICANN policies that impact them. Raise challenges/issues faced by registrants.
