Candidate Statement

Thank you for the nomination to me as Co-Vice-Chair of APRALO.

I can offer my services to APRALO based on my experience not only in ICANN but also other key Internet organisations such as the Internet Society and the IGF on a global, regional and national level. I have a strong understanding of the priorities and processes in various organisations and have built up a wide network of associates.

We can all learn from each other and I bring that to APRALO in terms of both work and geographic culture. I wish to repay that training by engaging in APRALO in a leadership role through communication, collaboration and commitment.
