#### **ICANN BYLAWS**

The ALAC is responsible, working in conjunction with the RALOs, for coordinating the following activities:

- Keeping the community of individual Internet users informed about the significant news from ICANN;
- Distributing news about ICANN, and information about items in the ICANN policy-development process;
- Promoting outreach activities in the community of individual Internet users;
- Developing and maintaining on-going information and education programmes, regarding ICANN and its work;
- Establishing regional outreach strategies about ICANN issues in each RALO's Geographic Region;
- Participating in the ICANN policy development processes and providing input and advice that accurately reflects the views of individual Internet users;
- Making public, ICANN's proposed policies and its decisions and their (potential) regional impact and (potential) effect on individuals in the region;
- Offering Internet-based mechanisms that enable discussions among members; and
- Establishing mechanisms and processes that enable two-way communication between At-Large members and those involved in ICANN decision-making, so interested individuals can share their views on pending ICANN issues.

- Enhanced coordination between the different groups within the Outreach brief – CBWG, SMWG, small resource development groups
- Focus on regional outreach leadership Outreach Liaisons
- Focus on more active implementation of regional strategic plans and feedback to the O&EWG
- Development of policy resources that can be used during outreach in regional communities
- Introduction of the Policy Ambassadors Programme to build regional policy leaders who can disseminate policy news from ICANN



The Regional Outreach Liaisons have the following responsibilities: (2019)

- Represent their region in the Outreach and Engagement Working Group (O&EWG) and provide updates on regional activities during the monthly O&EWG call
- Represent the O&EWG in their regions and update their region on outcomes from the monthly O&EWG call
- Develop the regional Strategies in collaboration with the Regional Leadership and the Global Stakeholder Engagement Team
- Lead outreach activities in their region in collaboration with the O&EWG
- Collaborate with the Capacity Building and Social Media Working Groups in the development of engagement activities
- Participate actively in established O&EWG communication channels
