ALAC Statement on the Draft Criteria and Process for Selection of Multistakeholder Ethos Award Pilot Program

Introduction

Olivier Crépin-Leblond, Chair of the ALAC and ALAC member from the European Regional At-Large Organization (EURALO) and ALAC Leadership Team member, composed an initial draft of this Statement after discussion of the topic within At-Large and on the Mailing Lists.

On that same day, Olivier Crépin-Leblond, Chair of the ALAC, requested ICANN Policy Staff in support of the ALAC to send a Call for Comments on the Recommendations to all At-Large members via the [ALAC-Announce Mailing list](#)

On 12 February 2014, a version incorporating the comments received was posted on the aforementioned workspace and the Chair requested that Staff open an ALAC ratification vote on the proposed Statement.
