Background



June 2007 - ICANN issued RFP for Independent Review of the ALAC

August 2007 - Westlake Consulting Limited responded

February 2008 - ICANN Board appointed WCL as independent reviewer



Aims of the Review



To determine:

- Whether the organization has a continuing purpose in the ICANN structure; and
- If so, whether any change in structure or operations is desirable to improve its effectiveness;
- ... and about 50 subsidiary questions.

- A means for individual Internet users to participate in ICANN's work
- A channel for ICANN's accountability to the community
- ALAC, like ICANN, is:
 - Bottom-up
 - Consensus-driven

This is a new ALAC



- Interim ALAC until 2007
 - focus on institution building
- Now...ALAC 1.0
 - gaining respect as contributor to ICANN
 - policy initiatives
 - outreach
- ALAC history is not a reliable predictor of ALAC future
- This review is forward looking





ALAC Structure - our views

- We identified 8 options
 - e.g. abolition, merger with other body, change to SO
- Option chosen: status quo with minor changes
 - just implemented
 - 5 years in building
 - no compelling reason to change fundamentals
- Recommendation: 2 year term for Chair

- ICANN geographic regional structure does not reflect:
 - global population or Internet users
 - AP growing rapidly, NA and EU levelling off
- Recommendation: keep RALOs, add 2 Asia members to ALAC
- Recommendation: review RALO role next time






Board Liaison

- Board members vote, Liaisons advise
- Duties of Board members
 - interests of ICANN are paramount
- Accountability of Liaison is to ALAC
- Recommendation: Board representative remains Liaison
- Recommendation (new): 2 year term

- ICANN support for ALAC has improved substantially this year
 - ...but there needs to be more
- Recommendation: Dedicated support for each RALO
- Recommendation: Chair to agree staff support level
- Recommendation: More and faster translation
