



What is an ALAC/At Large Working Group at ICANN?

An ALAC/At Large Working Group (WG) is an interdisciplinary collaboration of ALAC vs. At Large members working on certain activities that would come to foster Internet end-users participation in ICANN processes and policies. The lifespan of the ALAC/At Large WG can last between a few months and couple of years. An ALAC/At Large WG exists as long as it can provide solutions to the problems vs. issues it addresses. The WG decides when to terminate its activity.

An **ALAC/At Large Working Group** is intended to be a forum for cooperation and participation.

Programmes vs. policies elaborated, implemented and promoted by the WG should be evaluated by encouraging community input and support; this will ensure that such programmes meet the community's vision for its future.

The **WG** should also regularly seek community feedback on their policy and projects/programs.

An **WG** should have:

- **GOAL**
- **OBJECTIVES**
- **BACKGROUND DESCRIPTION/JUSTIFICATION:** Why is this WG important and how was it created? What are the main issues of the WG? What is the target group/audience of this WG?

- An **ACTION PLAN** including
 - a) a list of activities carried out by the WG;
 - b) task division (person/s responsible);
 - c) timeframe for this activity/s;
 - d) hardware vs software required;
 - e) additional resources required;
 - f) cost (budget) for this activity/s;
 - g) partners involved;
 - h) a list of expected outcomes and outputs;
 - i) evaluation indicators and instruments.
