I have been following ICANN's development since its inception in 1998 and even before during the consultations for the white paper on how best to shape and operate the nascent organization. i have participated to at least 20 of the ICANN's global meetings and have contributed in many ways: as a committee members and particularly as a pionneer of the at large users' involvement in the Icann progress. As of 2001, I have been a full member of the interim committee for the ALSC, then as an appointed member to the ALAC and was instrumental to the founding of the ALS movement. I am a member of the AFRALO, through the Internet Society of benin. As a member of the Presidential Strategy Committee (PSC), i was particularly keen on making sure the specific needs and preoccupations of the Internet users at large are represented to the delivery of the PSC;

Thus, i believe i meet the criteria as one of the pioneers of the ICANN development, and more over as one who contributed to the inclusion of the non commercial and the users' at large views and concerns. Also, i believe I have some sizeable insights on the issues pertaining to ICANN, namely its operations, its engagement with other supporting organnizations (ALAC and GNSO in particular) and its overall positionning in the current Internet Governance discussions.

ALSC: I contributed to the study on the At large Structure Committee, which portrayed the inclusion of the at large users in the Icann structure

ALAC: As a two term member, I provide policy advice and support to overall policy making structure of the ICANN

AFRALO: i was instrumental for the formation of the African regional structure, having

organized my own Internet chapter in benin as one of the fisrt members of the AFRALO and sn ALS of the ALAC

AFRINIC: I called for the first regional foruj on Internet Governance in 1998 in Benin, which created conditions for development of Afrinic as a registry. i was thus a member of the interim Board, and then elected chair of the Board from 2005 to 2009

NRO; i represented the Afrinic in the NRO during my tenure as Chairman of Afrinic

PSC: I was selected as a member of the president's strategy committee, while seating on the ALAC, representing the Africa region.

As an At large selected Icann Board director, i would like to help strenghen the multistakeholder approach which is one of ICANN's factory makeup and could be its weakest point. While recognizing the key role of the business and technical constituencies of ICANN, I would also make sure the concerns of the users at large are heard; thus, thoughout listening to the needs of the users, and understanding the technical and political implications, i hope to contribute to decision making process which garantee more balanced outcome and thereby a better representation of all regions and communities needs.

This I hope to do through a contribution to better outreach of the At large community, namely its current structures that are the ALAC, the ALS and other regional structures. I would like to contribute through a better exposure of the at large community to the technical developments of the Internet, as well as its financial and business implications. To do that outreach and capacity development, i will favour the use of web 2.0 technologies across all the 124 ALSes.

I have always believed that due to the international focus of ICANN's mission, its decisions should reflect the needs and aspirations of the global community. I hope to use my understanding of the issues, and the current debates and works in these fields to advance a balanced comprehension of the subjects by other fellow Directors and the subsequent decision taking which goes through consensus and inclusiveness.

I have spent the last 15 years in the UN and have travelled extensively to assist countries in integrating ICTs and the Internet in their overall development strategies; I therefore worked in a muticultural environment andam able to understand global issues; I participated to many regional and global Internet related initiatives and have contributed to foras such as the Internet Governance Fora as a speaker, a session moderator, and regional representative. I have been organizing an African initiative on Cybersecurity (Africa CIRT) which will build capacitiess for combatting cybercrime on the African continent. I am fluent in both the French and English languages and have a good understanding of the spanish language. I am a long standing member of the ALAC community and think I am well positioned to help advance the at large contribution to policy making process within the ICANN Board.
