Listed below is my Professional Career in chronological order. I started my career, after

Graduation, in Associated Cement Company Limited in their Machine Building Plant and learnt the nuisances of working of a large publically managed enterprise. I contributed here to the modernization of equipments and accessories and my contributions were viewed as exemplary.

Thereafter, I worked as 'Rocket Scientist' in the then newly started Indian Space Research Organization, a Government of India Department of Space Organization. There, I had opportunity to work closely, in a small set-up, with Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam, the legendary Indian Scientist, who grew to become President of Indian Republic.

In the early stages, I organized and managed Development and Testing Facilities relating to rockets and its systems.

In the event of my selection to ICANN Board, and before taking the seat in the Board, I will get in

touch with ALAC to familiarize myself with past ALAC Liaison to the Board and also current issues on which ALAC is keen to represent to the Board.

Thereafter, while being in touch with ALAC on continuing basis, I will work on such issues as running of IDNs, introduction of new gTLDs and fair and smooth transition from IPv4 to IPv6 whenever such issues are taken up in Board meetings, committees and other forums.

While keeping the mission and core values of ICANN in mind and not acting in a partisan way, it is possible to further the cause of At-Large community and act as their voice whenever and wherever there is an opportunity for me as a Board Member.

How?

As I will be in touch with ALAC, I will also keep in touch with At-Large Structures and RALOs. I will also try reaching of those multitudes of Internet Users who are not yet represented in At-Large. I will workout some two-way communication process that while I reach to them, they too can reach to me. This way, I will be able to gauge the current issues on which Internet Users wish to draw ICANN attention.

I am sure to be successful in serving the interest of Internet User Community as a whole.

Poll Heading: 6. Is there any additional information you would like to submit that would be helpful to the BCEC in making its decision? If so, please summarize it here

Yes. There is one small thing that reflects by make-up and success at the same time. I believe in the maxim that: 'Anything can be learned by Study'

And my own that: 'One can be successful in anything with study and hard work'.

Beyond this, I will like to detail my Internet Journey and how I served Internet Enthusiasts (not users at the time) and Internet Users.

I used to write in print media in India on science subjects on regular basis. When Internet started appearing in India in a small way in 2006, my publishers wanted me to contribute on Internet. I had an opportunity to travel to USA and study the subject starting from its beginning and its progress over the time. While I returned to India, my son, then a student in an American University kept me posted with the developments.

I then started writing articles and later columns in Indian print media suited to un-informed readership. I also started organizing lectures later seminars on the subject using the platforms

provided by Professional Bodies where I was represented in Committees. Thereafter, Web publications started in India and my thought provoking articles appeared in large numbers in Indian as well as foreign media.

I was recognized as 'Pioneer of Net Journalism in India'. I also penned a book on Indian Internet/Technology stalwarts in Silicon Valley; their biographical sketches and details of their work. Founder of Hotmail is such a person featured in the book that became huge success in India. It found market in US Universities and in other countries.
