Survey objectives

- **Purpose**: To gauge APRALO interests and priorities for Policy Issues and Workstream2 Topics.
- Aim: to encourage APRALO ALS members join one of the working groups based on their interests and priorities and to share their views on their chosen topic/s.
- Participation: 23 out of 45 ALSes responded to the 2016 survey (30 answered the 2015 survey)


How do I make a contribution to a public comment on a topic of interest?

- On the home page, you will also find on the top right, a section entitled "Latest Policy Advice"
- The bar graph will indicate how far along the public comment process the advice as a statement has developed. Click onto one of these topics and join in the conversation that takes place before a statement is actually drafted up for submission to its requesters.
- A total blue line means that the statement has been completed and voted on, and has now been submitted to its source constituency or even the ICANN Board.



What are the Policy-related interest areas for APRALO?










What are the Workstream 2 interest areas for APRALO?





Background

- The concern expressed by some is related to the ability of the ICANN community (through the Board/NomCom/SO/ ACs, the review teams or other groups) to represent the diversity of views, origins and interests of the global Internet community
- On the other hand, while acknowledging the importance of diversity in the accountability mechanisms, diversity requirement should not prevail over skills or experience requirements
- A multidimensional approach will be useful to be taken into account regarding diversity



 - Transparency of Board deliberations






Human Rights – Medium to Long Term Work -More Complex Issue (though perhaps it shouldn't be)

- Background
 - In Work Stream 1, there was a <u>CCWG-Accountability Working Party 4</u> tasked with addressing the topic of Human Rights
 - A separate community-led group, which has been active for a while, called the Cross-Community Working Party on ICANN's Corporate and Social Responsibility to Respect Human Rights (or CCWP-HR)
 - Many members of the CCWP-HR have been active in the CCWG-Accountability on human rights issues
 - Human rights impact assessment list of documents and publicly available information about ICANN
 - Work Stream 2 to develop a Framework of Interpretation for Human Rights (FOI-HR)
 - Bylaw provision will not enter into force before the FOI-HR is in place
