WHOIS IN BRIEF

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WHAT IS IT?

- Data captured on registration of a domain name.
 The WHOIS DATASET:
 - Data about the domain name licensee (registrant);
 or
 - The service that provides access to the data;
 or
 - The access protocol that supports the communications exchange to the data (RFC 954, later 3912)

WHOIS DATASET

- The Registered Name;
- The Registered Name Holder
- The names of the primary nameserver and secondary nameserver(s) for the Registered Name;
- The identity of Registrar
- The original creation date of the registration;
- The expiration date of the registration;
- The name and postal address of the Registered Name Holder;
- The name, postal address, e-mail address, voice telephone number, and (where available) fax number of the technical contact for the Registered Name; and
- The name, postal address, e-mail address, voice telephone number, and (where available) fax number of the administrative contact for the Registered Name.

WHAT IS IT?

- As service and protocol:
 - enables anyone to look up information about a domain name or IP address.
 - The information provided includes the domain name registrant's name, address, phone number, email address, and other details.

Purposeful

 provides transparency and accountability in the registration of domain names and other resources

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Trust and compliance
 - Role in consumer confidence for business online
- Mulling name availability
- Intellectual property protection
- Safety and security
- Network stability and resilience

WHEREABOUTS OF REQUIREMENTS

- Imposed on Registrars:
 - In their contract with ICANN; Registrar Accreditation Agreement (RAA 2013)
- Imposed on Registries
 - Under individual contracts with ICAN
- ccTLDs also impose WHOIS requirements but they are national in scope and with no ICANN oversight

THE PROBLEMS

- Lack of a coherent policy
 - The "Thin" and the "Thick" WHOIS issue
- Data Accuracy
- Access and response
 - One-by-one query/lookup tool
 - Bulk access via Port 43
 - Decentralized
- Violations of Privacy Protection laws; GDPR

THE RESPONSES

- Consensus Policies
 - RAA 2013 Specifications; Accuracy; Privacy/Proxy
 - Thick WHOIS; last big thin WHOIS registries to migrate to thick format
- WHOIS Reviews
 - Two to date WHOISR1 & WHOISR2
 - WHOISR2 addressed the implementation status of recommendations from WHOISR1
- Expert Working Group (EWG)
- EPDP

WHATS NEXT

- The policy implementation kerfuffles continue
- The policy making continues
- The privacy issues continue
- The access issues are being addressed by SSAD
