

Marita Moll is a Canadian researcher, policy analyst and public interest advocate. As a private citizen and in collaboration with various public interest groups, she has been active since the mid-1990s in Internet policy discussions in Canada -- intervening in many government and regulatory policy processes; organizing and contributing to grass-roots discussions; producing written materials; and speaking to groups on emerging issues.

From 2015-2018, she was a member of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Internet Registration Authority (CIRA). From 2018-2022, she served as a North American Representative on the 15 member At Large Advisory Committee (ALAC).

She is the president of Telecommunities Canada (TC), a Canadian not-for-profit corporation which promotes Canadian community networking at the national and international level. TC is an At Large Structure (ALS) with the North American Regional At Large Organization (NARALO).
