Dear RySG,

Thank you very much for the input received concerning new gTLD applicant decisions and milestones. We appreciate and understand that potential applicants need certain pieces of information at certain points in time to inform their planning and decision-making processes.

As you may be aware, we've been working on the detailed planning for the different workstreams and projects that cover the implementation of the New gTLD Program: Next Round. On that basis, we are pleased to share the following information in relation to each of the items that were included in the list:
