What does it mean to have a balanced NomCom?

• A balanced NomCom would be one which is composed of members from each constituency. Currently this is nnot the case as NPOC has not been given an opportunity to have a delegate from its constituency on the NomCom

• What criteria would you apply to measure that the NomCom is balanced?

• If in one constituency there are individual groups that have their own MOU or agreement with ICANN than they should also get a delegate to the NomCom

Responses to the Letter on NomCom Rebalancing

- Do you support the need for the current composition of the NomCom to be rebalanced? Please explain why or why not.
 - At Large had been a proponent of the Rebalancing effort as we think that all constituencies should have an opportunity to elect delegates to NomCom.
 - Since the ICANN Board and the PTI Board represent all constituencies within ICANN all the separate Constituencies within ICANN should be involved in helping to select these delegates and it is wrong that some constituencies are left out.
- How frequently does the balance need to be checked and reset?
 - At Large suggests that a review of the number of delegates selected by constituencies should occur every:
 - 5 years, 5-7 years, more than 7

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- How do you suggest that the NomCom be rebalanced?
 - At Large suggest that each constituency be given at least one slot.
 - ALAC has 5 slots since we have 5 different RALOs each with its own agreement with ICANN.
 - If there are other constituencies that have a similar agreement with ICANN then they should also be given an extra slot
- Who should conduct this work, and how should it be conducted?
 - ALAC thinks this should be done by a Cross-Community Working Group consisting of representative from each of the constituencies
- How would your community group prioritize this work within your planning efforts?
