Activities Not Included For Prioritization During FY25 Planning

• GNSO PDP:

- New gTLD Program Next Round recommendation approved by the ICANN Board March 2023
- Registration Data Request Service (RDRS) recommendation approved by the ICANN Board in February 2023
- Board adopted Specific Review Recommendations:
 - In some cases, recommendations are approved by the Board, but are not yet applicable for prioritization, e.g. if the recommendation can't be implemented yet because it's depending on the implementation completion of another recommendation.
 - Any activities that were previously prioritized but have not yet commenced within 2 years of its date of prioritization cannot be prioritized again. If work remains uncommenced after two years it will be included again for prioritization.


• Advice activities:

 Advice activities are excluded from the FY25 Planning Prioritization process as the current process for implementation design needs to be further aligned to fit the selection criteria of the planning prioritization process.



Prioritization Technique Proposed

- Evaluating Urgency:
 - A deadline to meet?
 - A dependency to another recommendation?
- Evaluating Importance:
 - Determined as "high priority" by Review Team? (For Reviews Recommendation only)
 - o Mission critical?
 - o Strategic?
 - o Operational excellence?
- The matrix results in 4 level of priority
 - P1 = highest Priority
 - P4 = lowest priority




Planning Prioritization Framework Background

- Planning Prioritization Framework is one of the deliverables of "Planning at ICANN" Operating Initiative in the Operating Plan
- The Framework is intended to serve as a guide the prioritization process during the annual planning process
- The Framework describes and outlines what to prioritize, who will prioritize, when and how to prioritize
- The Framework is developed and updated based on input received from the numerous webinars and consultation workshops with SOs/ACs and other stakeholders. The Framework will continue to evolve at as needed basis
- The latest Framework is <u>Planning Prioritization Framework Version 3</u>
 (V3)



New Step in the Annual Planning Process







Framework: Activities To Be Prioritized

The chart below illustrates at a very high-level, how the work flows through different phases within the ICANN ecosystem.



- Based on the framework, the activities in scope are Board approved implementation work, which include:
 - PDP recommendations
 - Review recommendations
 - Advice work
 - o CCWG
 - Other non-policy recommendations



Considerations used when prioritizing

- **Prioritization Techniques:** A prioritization technique is a tool to foster decisions
 - The technique is a starting point for discussion and the process uses judgement and is subjective
- Eligibility: not all items are eligible to prioritize
 - The activities to be planned for implementation by org are Board Adopted activities
- Evaluating urgency: urgency with which the task needs to be carried out
 - Hard or external deadline?
 - Immediacy of impact to org or community?
 - Known dependencies?

• Evaluating Importance:

- Mission critical?
- Strategic Objective related?
- Accountability related?
