Current Status of African ccTLDs

Overview of existing African ccTLD registries

- Many established in the 1990s/early 2000s
 - Varying levels of development and activity
-
- **Barriers to growth**
 - Lack of registrar competition
 - Limited local web hosting infrastructure
 - Low internet penetration rates in parts of Africa



Models of Growth

Case studies of African ccTLDs that have achieved growth

- .za (South Africa): 1.9 million registrations
- .ke (Kenya): growth from 20,000 to over 160,000 since 2010
- Strategies used: marketing, reduced registration costs, registrar incentives

- Marketing strategies, registrar incentives, partnerships



Way forward & Recommendations

Increase local registrar competition

- Provide incentives for registrars to promote domain registration

Invest in marketing to local companies/entrepreneurs

Leverage partnerships with telecom providers, web hosting companies, etc.

Advocate for improved internet infrastructure

Support the local Internet community/ALS
