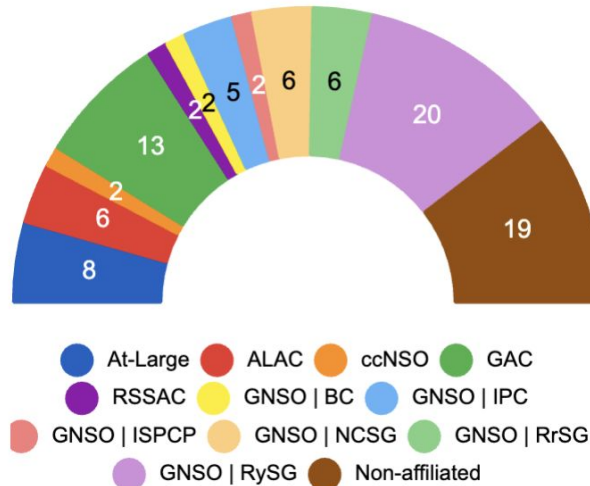

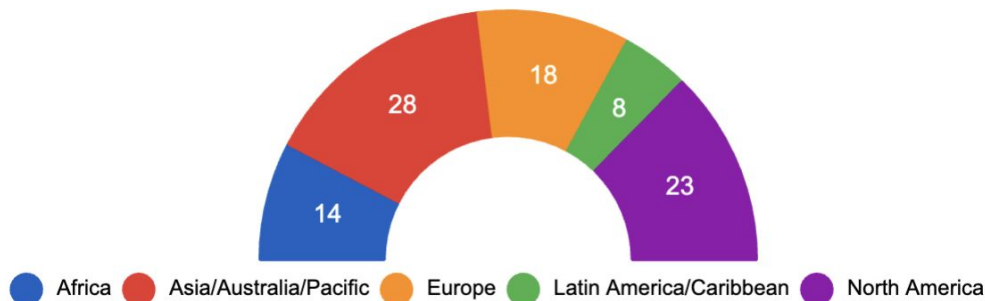

Project Description

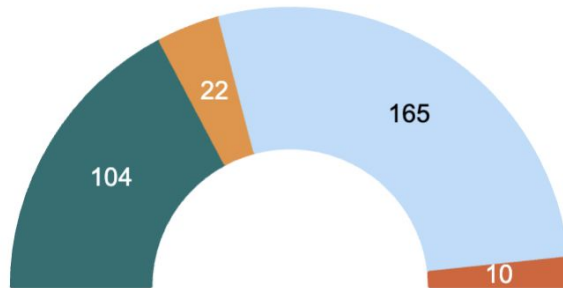
The SubPro IRT assists ICANN org in the implementation of the policy outputs in the Final Report in the new gTLD Subsequent Procedures Policy Development Process.

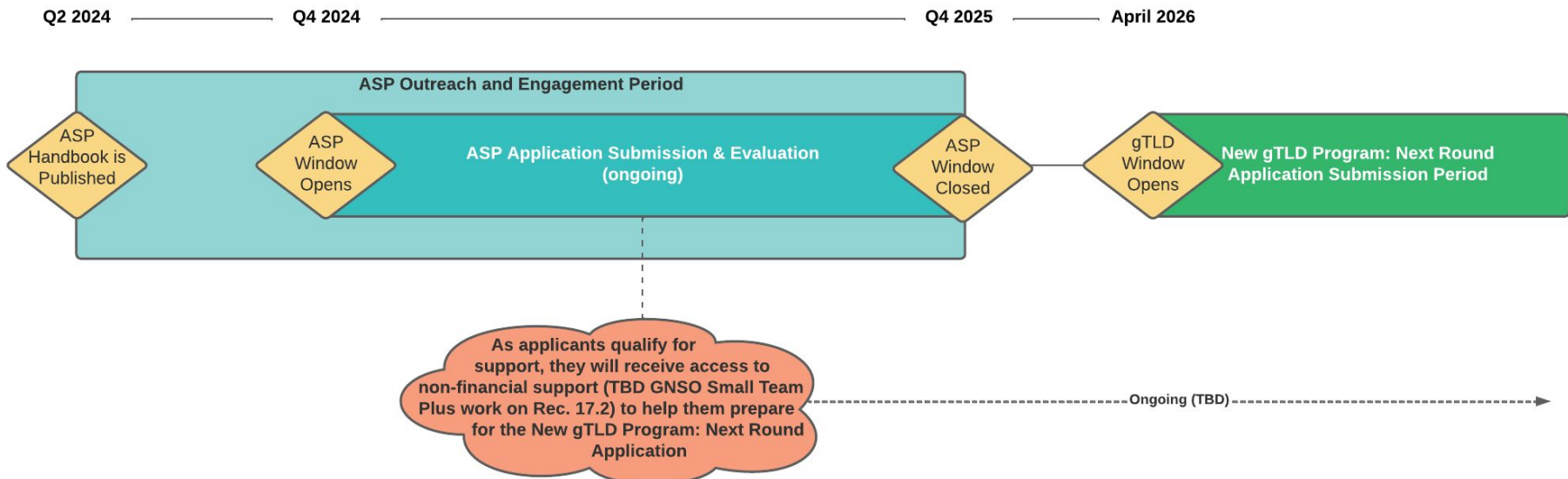
Reminder: Roles & Responsibilities for the IRT ASP
