




Problem Statements



- 1. What is your stakeholder group's position on Alternative Naming Systems? Supportive, Oppose, or Neutral?
- 2. Can Alternative Naming Systems be included into the scope and governance structure of ICANN? If so, how? If not, should it be prohibited, and how?







Plenary (35 mins)

Representatives of each stakeholder group are to deliver their opening statements for both problem statements

Each group (5 mins)

Open floor (20 mins)









In-Group Discussion

(20 mins)

Each stakeholder group discusses the topic among themselves.

Digest statements of other groups and adjust positions.









Cross-Community Breakout Discussion (25 mins)

Find consensus on both problem statements

GAC (Chair + ½ groupmates) and ALAC (Chair + ½ groupmates)

GAC (Vice Chair + ½ groupmates) and GNSO (Chair + ½ groupmates)

ALAC (Vice Chair + $\frac{1}{2}$ groupmates) and GNSO (Vice Chair + $\frac{1}{2}$ groupmates)


















Conference Timeline Part 2









In-Group Discussion

(25 mins)

Chair/ Vice-chair give an update on cross-community breakout discussion.

Members share information obtained from working coffee break chats.

Adjust and prepare final statements.









Plenary & Wrap up (40 mins)

Regroup for closing & consensus statement:

Each stakeholder group to present its updated statement and position on the problem statements.

Can be 2 spokesperson- for agreement and disagreement or what still needs to be agreed upon.

Open floor (Target to work towards consensus)









Etiquette for Model ICANN Conference

- Raise your hand if you want to speak. Wait until you are given the floor by the moderator before making a comment or statement.
 - The mock conference moderator will keep a queue to allow equal opportunities for all participants to speak.
- Mention your name and affiliation before you speak.
- Keep your comment and statement to the point. Keep it concise.
- Respect others' opinions. Use respectful language and avoid personal attacks or derogatory remarks.
- Give everyone a chance to speak. Avoid dominating the discussion and don't interrupt while someone else is speaking.






